I've always been a fan of amnesia stories (blame *Overboard*), and this one didn't disappoint. If you're in the mood for a tale with an evil villain, a heroine forced to make difficult choices, a hero who has to grapple with betrayal in order to be heroic, and a hard-won, truly satisfying happily ever after, you'll love this book. While not my favorite of Merrill's books (mostly because of the external source of conflict in the evil villain), it was among the better books I read in 2014. Merrill has a way with character that is a joy to read.

I enjoy reading novels by Christine Merrill because she often brings original storylines to the historical romance genre. In one of her earlier books, for example, she reunites a married couple in which the husband is losing his eyesight, but he is too proud to share this disability with his wife. You don't often find main characters with such physical disabilities, only emotional "disabilities" in romance novels. In this particular book ("The Truth about Lady Felkirk") Ms. Merrill introduces to the much mysterious Justine, who very slowly reveals her secrets to the readers as well as to the man with whom she falls in love. All we know from the very beginning of the book is that Justine is pretending to be married to William Felkirk. She is the only person who is aware of the deception, but she has him and all of his relatives convinced that they are married as he exists in a coma for 6 months and then finally becomes conscious. The story was a bit slow to build and the lovemaking scenes aren't well detailed, which was a disappointment to me. Justine also doesn't seem to express much of her own thoughts and emotions until the very end; the story examines her more from the point of view of William. But I enjoyed the mystery and intrigue that gather steam within the story and then explode near the end--with a jewelry heist and murder.

I was reading the first book written by Christine Merrill (The Inconvenient Duchess) and received this advance copy in the mail, so it was a unique experience to read her first and newest book back to back. My first comment will be that she was an amazing author with her first book and has continued to weave a wonderfully entertaining story with her newest book, "The Truth About Lady Felkirk". "Who is this beautiful woman?", the cover of the book asks. Well she is a woman pressed down by life's circumstances that never let her spirit be killed. She is a women of loyalty, kindness and obedience (by demand, but also in her nature). The story of Justine and William is a tangled web of deceit and forgetfulness, that brought them together, but true love is the final result.

Can she keep everyone safe, get everyone what they want, and still manage to hold on to the unexpected love she has found?

I found the amnesia situation believable and the reasons for the deception compelling. I'd definitely recommend this book. The Truth About Lady Felkirk is an enjoyable, if somewhat predictable, story in which the romance is peppered with a dash of mystery in a plot that revolves around theft and murder.

Lord William Felkirk wakes up with what he believes to be a massive hangover, aching all over and almost unable to move. His brother Adam, the Duke of Belston, immediately summons an unfamiliar young woman to Will's bedside, introducing her as Justine – Lady Felkirk, explaining that Will had married her on impulse shortly before the accident which caused the head injury that almost killed him. Will is stunned to discover that he has just awoken from a coma, and that he has been incapacitated for the past six months. He's bewildered and exhausted, but not weak-minded – and is very sceptical about his supposed marriage. He's never been the impulsive sort, and has no memory whatsoever of a wife, their marriage, or the events immediately prior to his waking up. He is not suffering from amnesia as such; he knows where he is, who he is and recalls his life up until the accident, and is immediately suspicious of this lovely, but rather reserved young woman who claims to have married him.
