This is a short story about two professional minor-league hockey players who both happen to be gay and by coincidence end up as roommates. Although it seems obvious to Mac that Fritzy and he are attracted to each other, Mac is determined to keep their relationship platonic and professional. When the couple finally find themselves alone together, Fritzy propositions Mac, and they do the nasty.

I'm all for fun, no-strings-attached erotica. I like hot, steamy sex scenes. I like masculine men. Blah blah blah. But what really annoyed the hell out of me about this story is the way the author had to add so many jibes about gay guys who didn't happen to be masculine jocks, insinuating that they are in some way inferior.

At one point in the story the author states, "The gay boys he had encountered before Fritzy seemed like a different species. They were fae and cliche, totally embracing the cultural identity they were told came along with sexual preference."

SERIOUSLY?!

Excuse me, but nobody gave me an instruction manual on the requirements of being a fag. I didn't play with Barbie dolls as a kid and sing show tunes as a teenager because society taught me to do so. I just wish the editing were a bit better. Most of the editing problems are just minor typos, but there are a lot of them. There is one instance where the author wrote "preference," when I can only assume from the context she meant "preface." Editing issues aside, the whole story is worth reading for this one sentence:

Someone had told him once that homophobia was just believing that gay men were going to treat you the way you treated women.

That made me want to stand up and cheer. It's *so true*.

Anyway, the story is very simple. Closeted gay hockey player meets closeted gay hockey player, and they get it on. A few reviewers have said the ending was too abrupt, but I actually thought it fit the tone of the story well. I don't feel the need to know exactly what happens next. They're big boys; they'll figure it out.
