This was a moderately entertaining book about a caterer who specializes in desserts, engaged to make the wedding cake for the “Christmas Wedding of the Season.” The bride and groom are from rival computer gaming families and someone is angry enough to try to keep the bride from making the wedding ceremony, let alone celebrating the honeymoon. The caterer investigates to clear herself of suspicion and to help her client.

This book had potential, but was rife with grammatical errors – I counted 12 before I gave up. Likeable characters, decent plot, but things like using “there” instead of “their” and “Chocolate Santa’s” (Chocolate Santa’s what?) and other poor editing choices made me crazy.

I think this book would greatly benefit from some professional editing, or at least some sharp-eyed beta readers.

Oh, this is Book 2 in the series. I didn’t figure that out until I looked it up on Amazon to write the review. I didn’t find the references to events occurring outside the book to be annoying, so these could be read out of order if one wanted to.
