The plot is set in the future, where a few people are called together and given an option to either receive two thousand dollars instantly, or join a lottery (a version of dead pool) where the last surviving member of the lottery wins a huge cash prize, a hundred million dollars.

The main character is a journalist who enlists herself in this lottery. What seems to start as lottery which won't be ending for at least a few decades, quickly turns into Hunger Games. The story is fast paced, with interesting characters, and a ton of plot twists.

The beauty of the story actually lies in the setting. Being set 2066-2067, the author describes many futuristic changes in the technology, society and people.
