I had to push myself to finish this, I'd even slipped in a non arc in the hopes that I'd get thrown back into this storyline, I just really struggled with this one.

Mistaken Identity is a suspenseful, psychological novel that makes the reader question what happens when you forget who you are.

Lena wakes up in a strange basement, tied up, and as the captive of a man she doesn't know. Nor does she have any other memories besides her name and that she was looking for her twin sister, Anna. It leads Lena on a journey to find out who she is, what her past is like, and what happened with her sister's disappearance.

The story definitely starts with the conflict. Lena's abducted and suffering from amnesia, and much of the story is her looking for clues. She almost takes her capture too well for me. I expected more emotion up front. And then she gets the feeling that her captor knows what happened to her twin sister, and she plots to find out the truth.

It started to drag for me in the middle. Not much really *happens*. There's plenty of suspense at the beginning, but then the internal monologues became overly long, and the same thoughts were rehashed over and over. The story wasn't propelling forward enough and as such, my attention drifted. The plot kicks back into gear at 80%, but by then, it was ending. I did enjoy how everything came together though.

I think a reader who loves a good, suspenseful story line would enjoy this one. It just missed its mark on the action and romance portions for me.
