4.25 Stars! Reaped From Faerie is book two in the Stolen Magic series. After stumbling onto book one while browsing, I was very happy to read on and learn more about our snarky, impulsive Sophie.

Summary:

Sophie Morrigan excels at her job in FAB's Magical Object Division. After all, what better way is there to appease her covetous nature than by tracking down dangerous magical artifacts? Lately, though, her work has had a common theme and it's getting a bit tired. Everyone knew her connection to The Morrigan, but her dragon rescue and face-to-face in Faerie brought it to the forefront again, and now every death magic case that comes into the bureau lands on her desk. Sophie just wants things to get back to normal, where her job is her job, and her personal life isn't in any way involved or talked about. Sophie's interest is peaked when she's tasked with the case of a dead reaper and a stolen scythe. But her interest quickly becomes grief and anger when she learns that the thief also murdered one of her Banshee sisters. In her quest for justice, Sophie will have to look inside herself and come to terms with her parentage and childhood. She'll also go up against a dangerously delusional witch, intent on her demise. Failure isn't an option because it's not only her life hanging in the balance, but her soul.

I really enjoyed reading book one of this series, and so was happy to start book two right away. Sophie is a fun heroine to read. Not only because she is a badass Supernatural FBI agent, but also because she's funny, sarcastic, cares deeply, and endears you to her with her awkward social skills. Her relationships in this book are developed with a vengeance. We see her work environment has gotten worse with the gossip after her trip to Faerie, and it's even affecting the types of jobs she receives. But her personal relationships are the major focus. We learn more of Sophie's family, how she felt growing up, and also see her get the reassurance she needs to move on. I loved her heart to heart with Belinda because it gave us a peek into Sophie's life, and the reason behind her mostly loner lifestyle. That, added to her revelations with Owen only serve to make Sophie an even more engaging character. I also feel that there is more to Owen than meets the eye, given his worried behavior about Sophie's internet stalking abilities, and the interaction with Hammond. Hopefully, we'll see answers about that in the next books. In the end, I appreciated the world building and action this book provided. It was fast paced with an uncomplicated plot. Sophie's continued growth answers as many questions as it gives us new ones, but I look forward to hunting those down with her. My only criticism was that at times Sophie took her prickliness a bit too far, and it annoyed me. This was rare, but it was a little too much even for her closed personality. There wasn't so much a mystery since we learned the villain's identity pretty quickly, but the hunt for the scythe makes for more than enough action to keep you entertained. The ending is the best with the battle, and I can't wait to see what more Sophie can do, as well as see where her relationship with Owen goes. ?

Sophie Morrigan's mother is THE Morrigan, renowned for her battle prowess and insatiable appetite for violence. Most fear her, some worship her, and her daughters wonder why she keeps having and abandoning children. Sophie is raised by one of her sisters, Belinda, in the insular Banshee community comprised entirely of Morrigan daughters. In many ways, she is more like her fabled mother and has unique talents and attributes that make her feel like an outsider. When Sophie reaches adulthood, she decides to move away and work for the Faerie Artifacts Bureau (FAB) in the Magical Object Division (MOD) as a field agent hunting down and retrieving dangerous magical items before they create too much havoc in the Faerie or human realms.

Since her return from Faerie...and a highly gossiped about visit with mom (that of course ended in carnage and destruction), all of Sophie's cases have been "death" object related. While this is annoying, she finds herself more invested in building her new friendships and figuring out how to respond to Owen's romantic overtures. Despite being anatomically female, Banshees are asexual creatures. Sophie is not, another difference that makes her feel isolated from her family.

When a Reaper's scythe is stolen, Sophie is put on the case. This one is personal, however. The theft occurred in her community and both a Banshee and Reaper were killed. Evidence points to witches, humans who learn to manipulate magic through ritual and charms but are snubbed by Faerie society.

She and her friends must solve the case before the murdering thief can carry out his or her nefarious plan.

This one felt a bit hectic. There was lots of running around and, in the end, Sophie solves the murders and retrieves the scythe (not really a spoiler). I think the most interesting part was learning more about Sophie's family and how childhood misconceptions impacted her adult choices and beliefs. Owen and the peripheral characters don't really develop much.
