I hate to be the one to NOT like a Beverly Jenkins book. I mean she is the GODDESS of AA romance novels. Literally. Her book, *Through the Storm*, I read back in high school and since then I have been the ultimate fan. Besides the fact of giving such rich characters in *Raimond and Sable*, Ms. Jenkins had dropped GINORMOUS golden nuggets of AA history (a staple that holds true in just about all of her historical novels). Things that you don't get taught in HS due to ignorance or laziness.

Unfortunately, this book does not meet the standard of the usual fabulousness that can be found in Ms. Jenkins' catalogue. There were numerous times throughout the book that I went against the urge to just put it down because the story line and interactions were so ill contrived. I pushed forward and continued reading on the strength that this is Ms. Jenkins and not some two-bit hack writer and wanting to catch up on the characters that were introduced in the first two books of the series.

Noah and Pilar were okay as characters. After the prologue of Noah being shanghaied and Pilar the confiscating his boat, the book just fell off. More than once I got the impression that rather than enjoying the characters she was writing, Ms. Jenkins just wanted to get the series over with. Where there were clear opportunities for depth, conflict and growth, the cookie cutter approach was taken and that left me sorely disappointed.

While I am always going to be a BJ fan, this book is not the best introduction to her historical romance works.

After *Destiny's Surrender* was so completely not for me, I was a bit afraid *Destiny's Captive* wouldn't work for me either. The fact that the romance was between Noah and the pirate woman who stole his ship seemed like it would be either the best of times or the worst of times.

I ended up reading this one pretty much straight through, which is always a testament to a book being really readable and having nice pacing. Logan and Mariah's book does remain my favorite, though, because I liked the romantic tension there the best.

Like the first book, there's a serious case of instalove here, and it's especially weird since Noah wanted to make Pilar pay for stealing (and sinking) his boat. Yet, the moment he lays eyes (and rapier—oo er) on her, he decides he wants to marry her instead, even though just before he'd been talking about how he never planned to marry because his love was the sea. Okay then. The scene was fun, because it was basically exactly the scene when Zorro fights Eléna de la Vega in *The Legend of Zorro* but the emotional part went too fast for me. I also really wanted Pilar to win the sword fight.

That said, I do like that Pilar keeps her strength throughout, and that he's turned on by her talent with a rapier and his trust of her on her word not to steal from his family. I did struggle with the fact that she was so willing to settle down in California without finding a way to help Cuba remotely with the family's funds though. Still, she taught the brothers about training horses and she gets to save her man-sel in distress, so that's pretty fucking awesome.

Jenkins' series has had great historical aspects throughout, and this one is no exception. I still love the giant cast. I think this book was excellent. I just wish I got the shippy feels more strongly.
