THE STORY

Finally it seems like they are finally going to meet and stop all this dancing around each other, but Sid has another plan in place, to me to try and make Jack jealous....

It is not just Sid or Jack trying to find information, it seems like there is somebody else interested in what they are doing. Jack realises that his cover he has in place in the virtual world is now not as it should have been....

This is a story where you can leave reality right at page one and the first order of recognition goes to Brandon Shire for being the master manipulator. He saw the whole picture from the start and moved the characters around as players in a high stakes drama, complete with action, deception, and a sexually charged atmosphere.

The plot of this series is difficult to discuss without everything being a spoiler. So let's start with Sid. Likable? Well, not so much most of the time. Sid is all about profit and all about what works to his best advantage and if he needs to teeter on the edges of ethics, so be it. His designer clothes and expensive car are his shields to the world. As the episodes progress, the layers of Sid are very slowly revealed and there is a moment that his edges are not so sharp, but it's short lived indeed. He comes off as a shark and, while he can

be intelligent and cunning, he doesn't often look at the big picture, is more insecure than he will admit to, and is blinded by dollar signs, which may ultimately be his downfall.

Now Jack was a bit easier to like. Oh, he's a high stakes career criminal that is first presented as a common street thug, but Jack hides a bit of compassion underneath that tough exterior for a few select individuals. This is only the first installment of a longer saga, ending with a near-cliffhanger, although not an acute one. The title is very apt. Both main characters live on the dark side of the law - Jack partly by force of circumstances, Sid by more deliberate choice.

Sid is a lawyer, and an all-around bastard. His difficult childhood has turned his life-philosophy into "Do unto others, first and hard, before they get a chance to screw you over." He has rare moments of human caring, but for the most part he forges ahead with his own agenda, sometimes even with gratuitous cruelty.

Jack is a data-thief, while also hunting for answers to the disappearance of his sister - an environmental activist - years ago. He's a guy with a moral code despite how he earns his money, the prototypical American romantic hero (as Amy Lane describes them) who will choose his people and his family over the greater good or the law every time. He is fascinated by Sid, after a conspiracy of big oil firms and their lawyers brings them into contact, and his newfound determination to protect Sid, even from his own mistakes, makes Jack's life and that of his team difficult.

Sid's a hard guy to like, and he's not redeemed even by the end of this book. The author is skillful enough to make me hold out hope for his future, but it's going to be an uphill climb. I admit when everyone around Jack said how perfect Sid was for him, I didn't see it. I wanted Jack to find a real good-guy. But that wouldn't be the train-wreck fascination that is this story.

A fast-reading, exciting, sometimes violent, sometimes infuriating, twisty story. I'll have to pick up the second volume, since I can't stop here.

It's hard to write a review for this box set because my mind was blown reading the episodes. I have to say that this series was not what I expected at all. The blurb was a little vague and on the short side. Not that that's a bad thing. Sometimes the best surprises come from the lack of expectation. From the title, though, I had thought it would be a romance. After reading it, I would definitely not consider it a romance. Sid and Jack did find themselves attracted to each other, and at the end of the episode 6 had developed care and concern for each other, but it was far from a love story. There was some erotica, but most of the sex scenes that took place weren't even between the two mc's. I would definitely place this story in the category of Gay fiction, and it was a very good example of the genre.

The characters were the first thing to surprise me. First off, Sid is a lawyer, and maybe I should blame Law and Order, but I expected him to be a good guy. Jack was standing trial for a robbery, in which he had nicked Sid with a knife. He was clearly the bad guy. Almost immediately though, my perceptions were flipped. I couldn't believe the lengths that Sid would go through to win a case or dig up dirt on a rival law practice. Not to mention the way he treated the tricks he picked up for the night. Jack is still far from being a good guy, but he treats people 100 times better than Sid does, and he appears to be trying to stop an unnamed group from hurting people. So I was definitely thrown by them, and wondered how I could like a story whose main characters were so twisted and somewhat bad. But I did. I loved it. Throughout the story we do learn things about Sid and Jack that make them more understandable. While Sid didn't grow on me, Jack did, and I really did like him by the end. There were a lot of secondary characters to love and hate as well. My favorites were Sweeny, Drake, and Lori, members of Jack's team.

There was a lot of intrigue going on in *The Love of Wicked Men*. It had a good amount of mystery, though neither of the main characters had the job of cop, detective, or FBI agent.
