However, there was one thing that was missing for me and I felt a little cheated by it; Keira, I wanted more of her reunion with Parish. Her character so directly effects the Parish we got to know in the first book she was what made him so very anti-social, living in the caves and hating humans. And now she's back and we don't get to experience any of the emotions that I felt would have benefitted the story. I was so looking forward to this book written by two authors who I love very much! Alexandra Ivy wrote the first story in this book, and Laura Wright wrote about my main hunk of a man Jean-Baptiste! (warning: he is such a HOTTIE!! Tattooed and pierced! *fanning myself still!**) The only disappointing thing about this book is that the stories are just too short! I love this shifter world these authors have created, and the shifter men are sexy, loyal, and possessive..what more could a gal ask for!

First up, we have Bayon; he is a golden haired, muscular Hunter with a reputation of being a man whore..(he claims he isn't really though!) While he is on a job looking for some humans who have hurt his leaders woman and unborn child, he comes across a female in a cage. To his shock he discovers the female is his leader's sister, Keira; who has been missing for 25 years. Keira has been held captive in a cage for 25 years and she feels that she is broken. At first when Bayon saves her, she has no recollection of who he is; but that doesn't last long and quickly she remembers that these two have history of extreme attraction. After wasting so many years of not acting on their attraction, these two give in to their sexual tension extremely fast, and Bayon decides not to wait to claim her as his own.

Keira impressed me with how fast she went from being broken to wanting to find the evil people who held her and demand retribution. The reunion with her brother was so emotional, and I just loved how even though this was a short story Alexandra Ivy was able to get all of the emotions from Keira's captivity out into her tale. The mating between her and Bayon was also so emotionally explosive, and I was so happy that this couple got to be reunited after all of these years. Of course, there are some secrets revealed about who exactly is involved in harming Parish's (Keira's brother and leader of the Hunter's) mate and unborn child, and this ends the story with the question of how many traitors are running around the Wildlands?

Next up, we have my favorite: Jean-Baptiste and Genevieve Burel. What I loved about this story is that Laura Wright pens a great love story between a bad boy, and a woman who comes across as very stuffy and uptight. Jean-Baptise has been called to go to New Orleans to bring back a Voodoun woman who may be able to help Parish's mate and unborn baby. Unfortunately, no one fully trusts that Jean-Baptise can not become wild and get the job done properly, so Parish demands that Jean take Genieve (the newest member of the Diplomatic Faction)with him and make sure that the job is done right. Both Jean-Baptiste and Genevieve are holding secrets from one another, and both are very intrigued and attracted to one another despite their huge differences. As the story progresses, so does the sexual tension and attraction. When this couple finally give into their desires, it has got to be one of the hottest sex scenes I have read in awhile! Sparks fly, and Jean-Baptiste is a wild as they come! Surprisingly, under all the buttoned up clothing Genevieve is also just a little bit wild, and explosively passionate. This couple is my favorite and when they let loose..whew...holy smoly...HOT STUFF!!

This book holds stories #3 + #4 of the Pantera series, and this series just keeps getting better and better. I liked this book better than the first one, though it still had its issues. First, are the cliff-hangers really necessary? I didn't used to have big issues with them in the past, but the one in this book was ridiculous. I actually heard a voice-over in my head saying, "tune in next week to see what happens next!" This book was longer than the first one, so each of the short stories had a few more pages to develop both the plot and the chemistry between the couples, but it still wasn't enough. There are still lots of questions, and a lot of action that takes place off-page because there simply isn't enough space to deal with it on-page. We are, however, starting to get more background information on the Pantera tribe and their nemesis, so it's getting more interesting. I just wish the information didn't have to trickle in so slowly. It felt like the chemistry between the couples was more developed in this book, though again (sorry for the broken record) I could have used more pages to build the tension between them. I'll read the next book because now I'm curious about the big bad as well as what the deal is with the elders. But this and the first book are the first things I've read by Alexandra Ivy that I haven't loved, which makes me a little sad.
