Some of the stories make . . . not much sense. Others are nice, obviously about the importance of friendship. Some bits are pretty cool and funny, others are kinda lame. Personally I think some of it isn't always appropriate for my daughter (she gets so . . . crazed about her ponies!) but as far as learning to read, well, you can't beat words + pictures, and since we've found her favorite series at the library, they keep her nose in a book a lot of the time.

Like the first 2 volumes, only recommended for fans of the show.

In the first 2 issues of this 4 issue volume, Big Mac is searching for nails during the summer festival. He's apparently cute and women really like the strong silent type, because 5 different ponies fall in love with him. The cutie mark crusaders are trying to get their cute marks in pyrotechnics, causing Big Mac more problems than his missing nails.

In the last 2 issues, we learn about how Shining Armor and Princess Mi Amore Cadenza fell in love, and also learn that Shining armor was a huge geek in pony high school.

The first 2 volumes were focused on an epic story. These 2 are more mini stories that let you know more about characters from the show you don't see much of.

I love these so much! The story was divided into two main stories. One focusing on Big Mac and the other on both Princess Cadence and Shining Armor. The art in these issues are amazing and very underrated. Love all the faces and the little things that are in the background.

The first part was the story of Big Mac going to the hardware store and buying a nail. While on the way he runs into every sort of problem. I love this one because its a slice of life story. Its fun to see Big Mac run into any imaginable issue with the townspeople and their Summer Wrapup Celebration. Princess Luna makes a big appearance in this issue. I love every part with her. She is blissfully ignorant on some things and that just makes me love her more. I also loved how all the town ponies fell in love with Big Mac. It made me smile from beginning to end.

The second half focused on how Shining Armor and Princess Cadence met in high school and feel in love (in a time period similar to our 80's. I liked seeing all the young versions of the ponies in their 80's fashion. This

actually made me like both characters more. I was indifferent with them before but I liked the backstories and the extra look in their past.

My favorite issue so far. The first half of the comic follows Big Mac on an unexpected adventure. The second half is a story about the history of Shining Armor and Princess Cadence's romance.

First of all, I really enjoyed this comic because it was centered around ponies other than the Mane 6. I also like that this issue wasn't one with villains. It was more of a "follow me around Ponyville" kind of story. Even though Big Mac doesn't "talk" in this comic, it was nice to see the thoughts in his head. In fact, I liked that they didn't make him talk out loud because then he stayed true to character. I really enjoyed what was going on in the background during the summer wrap up festival. There were a lot of little jokes here and there that I think older fans will appreciate.

The story about how Shining Armor and Princess Cadence got together was a bit cliché, but it was still cute. I never pegged Shining Armor as the nerdy type, so it was nice seeing him from the perspective of another. Again, some jokes in the background that were fun to catch.

I am a bit sad now that I've finished this. Volume 4 doesn't come out until later this year. I know it's just a collection of 4 of the issues and I could read them individually, but it's just so much easier to buy them together in a collected volume. So far, this comic has been fantastic. It's something I think that younger fans will enjoy, but older fans will enjoy even more. My husband and I love it! Can't wait to get my hands on the next volume later on this year. I'm going to pre-order it now. ;)

Each one of these volumes contains two full stories that are each divided into two full chapters. This one began with the story of Big McIntoch, Applejack's brother who only says "Nope." He's gone to town to try to find nails to fix the broken gazebo when he realizes that a festival is going on. He doesn't like crowds or to-dos and has to navigate a challenging set of obstacles to complete his task. It was okay. The second story was about how Princess Cadence and Shining Armor met and fell in love. Told like a John Hughes film complete with Shining Armor's Dungeons and Dragons obsession and a reference to Quantum Leap by a subsidiary character after the dance finally brings together the lovebirds. Lots of jokes for grown-ups in that one.

Travis says

This third volume of the series shifts the focus away from the Mane 6 and epic story lines to highlight some secondary cast members in more "slice of life" stories. This type of story really shines in My Little Pony. The series is more interesting and entertaining when it's simply cracking jokes and providing a good romp. There aren't even any villains in this volume.

The first story is about Big Mac trying to find nails to fix a gazebo. Hijinks ensue and ponies swoon as Big Mac makes his way through a festival on his quest for nails. I especially liked Spike's appearances at the midway point.

The second story is about how Shining Armor and Princess Cadance got together. This was my first exposure to these characters since I am still new to the world of MLP, so while this flashback story didn't have as much weight to it due to my lack of familiarity it was still an excellent pastiche of 1980s pop culture.

There are loads of references and jokes for older fans, from DJ Pon-3 singing a Beatles song to a Quantum Leap joke. Even the title of the second story, "Neigh Anything", is a play on the 1980s movie "Say Anything." The backgrounds are chock full of little details. Pay attention to all the tents during the festival.

The series would be better served by maintaining this style of story.

What really sells this volume is Cadence and Shining Armor.

Their "couple story" isn't heavy on plot, but the little pieces of backstory and jokes make it all worthwhile. it reminds me about every High School movie in existence, but that just makes me really bubbly and happy. It's a good type of nostalgia which is probably clouding my judgement, but this does seem to earn its 4 stars.
