I enjoyed the book to the extent that it was well written but as an erotic 'love story' it failed miserably. Cooper from 'Tease' apparently still has extremely strong sexual & emotional feelings for Beth, a client from his hooker days. Eighty percent of the book has Cooper in Beth's company which makes the reader extremely confused about the relationship dynamics between the couples created by the author in the previous books. Whenever Beth is in a crisis Cooper instantly drops everything & runs to her like a hound to a bone. Something that happens throughout the entire book. Mia's presence, Coopers purported 'love choice' from the first book is almost ghost like here.

Cooper: I deserted Beth before and what happened... I refuse to let her down again. If Mia can't understand that, then maybe she isn't the woman for me. You should've been there for Beth. Instead you were too focused on yourself.

Cooper as a character came across as extremely immature & nothing about his relationship with Mia was resolved satisfactorily & then they got married. That jump boggled my mind with everything else happening in the book.

Beth comes across as the most selfish heroine ever created. She should have totally stepped back from Cooper. She was always around him like stale fish. The book is so rushed towards the end I wonder if the author forgot to submit some chapters in for publication.

Cooper's thoughts about Beth:

"Fuck yeah," I mutter as my fist moves back and forth. I can't help myself. I can't get her out of my fucking head. All those times we fucked when she was my client... I've been anxiously awaiting the release of *Scandalous* ever since Missy Johnson announced that she would be writing it. It is a novella in the *Tease* series that brings together Coop, Mia, Beth, and Roman. That means I expected all of the sauciness of the previous books but multiplied. Unfortunately, while I did enjoy it, I can't say that it's my favorite of the series either.

As I was reading, I just kind of felt like the story fell flat. The beginning seemed to be a little all over the place and didn't really connect with the ending in my opinion. I couldn't understand the point of some of the conversations or things that happened; it almost felt rushed to me. Furthermore, the plot was pretty straightforward with getting the characters from point A to point B. The shining light for me was seeing the interaction between all the main characters. Because we got their individual stories in the first two books, it was perfect to see how becoming friends for the four of them would work out – especially given the nature of Beth and Cooper's relationship. It was nice to see the conflicts arise and need to be worked out for the individual characters, as well as their counterparts. I also loved the independence that Beth was working toward, but I do wish there was more of it. The mystery surrounding Roman came unraveled and I actually really appreciated his whole back story.

All in all, this wasn't a bad book but it's certainly not my favorite either. I wish more attention would have been paid to Beth's discovery about her father or deeper discussion into Roman's background. It felt like those were the driving forces of the book but just barely touched upon. I am a big fan of the ending though, and it definitely filled my heart with love and hope!
