I'm finding it very hard to extricate this book, *Conflict in Blood*, from its series and write a succinct, focused review. The problem is that while there are four books in the series, there is really only one story, one long, continuing story that was broken up into four parts. Compounding the problem was my decision to read all four books back-to-back. Which may not have been one of my brightest ideas because it feeds into the idea of there being only one book. In the end though, I think it's best to look at this series as one book with four very large chapters.

I can't imagine anyone picking up one of the middle books and making any sense of it. If you don't read this series from the beginning you'll be lost and the beauty of the story will be destroyed.

So, given all of that, I'll end this review with one statement; Whatever I've said in the reviews of the previous two books applies to this book as well. I give *Conflict in Blood* four stars.

In this third part of the Partnership in Blood series, the battle between the good wizards with the help of the local vampires, and the dark wizards continues.

The members of the Alliance continue to explore the bond between the vampires and wizards and how best to use the pairs. A rite is performed that helps to balance the magical energy that has been negatively affected by the war. The rite works in a sense, but it causes some interesting side effects amongst the pairs! Hot yummy sex for some, angry sex for others. This issue is also solved by Raymond, who tries so hard to be accepted by the Milice. There are a couple of wizard battles, including a fight for the Eiffel Tower, and a major player is captured by the enemy. There is a death that deeply affects Jean, and royally pisses him off. Not a good enemy to make!

On the romance side of things, Alain and Orlando try to work through Orlando's continuing and somewhat tiresome trust issues, Jean and Raymond, and Sebastien and Thierry are moving along in their developing relationships quite nicely. I'm finding that I'm liking both of those couple more during this read than my original time through this series five years ago, and I'm not liking Alain and Orlando quite as much. I'm not sure why that is! The two problem couples, Adele and Jude, and David and Angelique are making progress, but Jude is just a douche. David is not a douche, but is just clueless!

One of my issues with the last book was that it focused more on the relationships and didn't have enough plot for me, this book was a nice balance. Some relationship drama, but a nice bit of plot drama as well. The war has certainly picked up the pace between the two groups, there were more battles and more of interest happened. Not that I didn't like the last book, but this one was tighter somehow. I liked that I could see the plot moving forward toward the conclusion, but we still got to see lots about the various couples.

I love different interpretations of vampire lore, it fascinates me that Ariel hadn't read a vampire book before writing these... I like the differences she introduced, and the similarities to traditional vampire stories as well. I love the various characters (except Jude, I HATE him!), and I love the world she has created. It's our world but not. I'm struggling with the French a bit, it's a language I don't know at all! But I wish I did...

I'm currently reading this book, and I am so grossly disappointed with its contents, I want to throw it in the garbage (but for the fact that I paid for it). Right now, I am reading through nothing more than a glorified rape scene between a female wizard and a Male vampire. It is absolutely offensive to have that trash in a purported romance novel. But, then again, if the author believes that forced sex is a substitute for romance, I believe that there is more wrong with this book than just the contents.

I will write more at the end of this book, but after the first 100 pages, I would give it zero stars if the goodreads system permitted such a rating. But for right now, I will give it the goodreads minimum of one star. I truly hope that the balance of this novel is better than the crap I have just read.

I am now nearly finished with this "book", and I have come to learn that this author is truly demented in the presentation of a romance novel. Rape and unimaginable cruelty has run rampant through this story. The author intertwines and equates romance and rape -- it is incredibly disturbing. In total, there are about 75 pages of this book that are worthwhile. For those who are following the plot of this series of books, here's a brief summary to help you to avoid this book -- good wizards cultivate the relationship with vampires; any wizard who forms a military alliance with a vampire ends up being madly in love with that vampire; battles occur and the good wizards triumph with the help of their vampire partners; vampire partners are required to feed from their wizard partners once or twice a day; Orlando gets kidnapped by bad wizards; Alain searches for Orlando. That's it -- everything else in this book is extraneous garbage.

Completing the book does not change my thoughts about how angry I am about this author wasting my time by writing this book! Zero stars from me, although goodreads has a minimum of one star. (I give that one star under protest!)

As the war wages the stakes get higher as the bonds between vampires and wizards grow.

The partnership between the wizards and the vampires was initially only meant to fight the dark wizards but now we have vampires walking in the daylight hours and couples falling in love left, right and centre.

The world that Ariel has developed in these books has great depth and it seems every day is a new discovery as the paranormal beings of society defy old legends and discover just how well they can work together.

There is still too much MF and FF in the story for my liking but that is purely my preference as it is not something I choose to read. By skimming these bits I don't feel that I missed any of the story.

As magical imbalances, kidnapped mortals, unscrupulous dark wizards and a myriad of other problems are thrown at the new alliance there seems no quick fix to ending the war. Serrier and his army always seem to stay one step ahead even though the alliance is having more luck at killing and capturing their enemies.

The story remains pretty much the same throughout all the books in this series and often there doesn't appear

to be much progress made. The real story for me was the relationships that developed, of which there are many, and this book ends on a cliff-hanger for the most important one of all.

I usually like to read a series back-to-back. But, this time I couldn't. It has been a couple of months since I read the first 2 books in this series. Even so, I picked right up in the story almost immediately.

Ariel Tachna gives us a unique view of vampires and sorcerers alike. The partnership between the two is something I have not seen before. The sex scenes, although not all are "scorching", definitely have something here for everyone. This particular book contains M/M, M/F, F/F, some "rough" play, although no

bondage I remember. There is one instance of possible non-consensual sex.

I become more caught up in the characters as the books progress. Even though Orlando and Alain are the main couple the story revolves around, many of the secondary couples are quite important. All are distinctly different in the way they interact with each other. Each couple seems to have their own flaw or hardship to overcome. With probably half a dozen couples, you would think the plot would get muddled. It doesn't. I don't know how she does it, but Ms Tachna is really good at revealing the private aspects of the couple's interactions while still moving the main plot along.
