After reading Dancing with the Devil and other stories, Tony's first book, I had the pleasure of reading his second offering. Sci-fi fiction is a hard thing to write convincingly and Leather pulls it off brilliantly here. In his first book, his book weaves stories of human pain, highs, lows and relationships, each one different from the next, and some quite thrilling and creepy.

This book also has these qualities, but they are set in futuristic worlds, and focus more on relationships with different races, species, and the effect on humanity of a variety of different issues.

My favourite two stories, which all flow well as a book, are Sweet Revenge and Cross to Bear. The fact that Leather writes a convincing story about Jesus actually being an alien sent to pillage humanity for his own race's ends, and his own gained humanity being his downfall, and our strength is very, very clever and although it might sound weird, it really works! Read this book for that story alone..

Sweet Revenge is darker, more sorrowful. A test tube baby grows up fighting for vengeance for her lost brother and late mother figure. The experiments carried out on her, leading to her being cast aside for destruction, are the tools she uses against her one time captors and persecutors, and the ending is meaty and satisfying. You root for the characters in the book for many different reasons, and the themes in the book do provoke some serious planetary food for thought.

All in all, a cracking read from the pen of Tony Leather, a greatly under-appreciated author. I hope 2012 is a brilliant year for him.
