Well, in the last volume of "King of Thorn" Iwahara really loses it and offers a horrible ending for a series that had started in an interesting (even if not very original or thrilling) manner.

Marco keeps being a very boring superhero. Kasumi keeps just doing nothing. And the plots keeps being worse than silly, a thing that doesn't really exist, plot a word Iwahara just heard about some day, somewhere, many years ago.

That "King of Thorn" was centered on the action was clear from the first volume. That a woken-up-without-knowing-why plot goes the supermonsters-created-by-the-worst-bad-ever route with absolutely-make-no-sense twists is just lazy, boring and repetitive. The 'high stakes' are incomprehensible (Marco and Kasumi are important because... oh, just because), things are ludicrous and the men-as-saviors messages are really annoying.

The ending of "King of Thorn" is just... bad.

Review of the series:

"King of Thorn" tells the story of the survivors of a horrible virus that were put in stasis and have woken up without knowing why, just to discover that instead of a vaccine what welcomes them are lots of very hungry monsters. The survivors will try to discover what happened at the same time that try to stay alive. Why are the monsters there, where do they come from? Did anyone else, somewhere, survive?

The story seemed to be a survival horror and it could have gone the route of mysteries and atmosphere, with some action to keep the reader on the edge of their seat. However, Iwahara decided to go on lots of action,

making one of the survivors a supermegahero (a man, obviously) who has the charisma of a stone. However, the action is very repetitive, and it doesn't help Iwahara's drawing style, which is a little bit of a mess, and the action also drags in some moments. Kasumi, the center of the story, is also whining, boring and the mystery behind her makes absolutely no sense. She is special because... well, the reader will discover that Iwahara has little to zero imagination (at least in this manga).

It is entertaining enough (because it is short enough, with not enough dialogue to drag the story), but it has the originality of a speaking fish in a movie for children. "King of Thorn" disappoints.
