Unfortunately, Wallace fails to captivate with his writing style, and perhaps worse, in a book providing "forensic evidence for the crucifixion" there is not one iota of physical evidence present.

There are numerous suppositions as to what PROBABLY happened, sprinkled with generic scriptures from the crucifixion story.

The author made no attempt to use historical evidence of the crucifixion (of which there is plenty) and instead jumps from idea to idea.

I read the book to help myself learn more about the crucifixion and to be able to defend it's credibility with

others, but instead I felt like I received a very watered down account of what I already knew.

I left the book unsatisfied and disappointed.

It will especially appeal to those who are interested in detective work. However, this will be too brief for anyone wanting a thorough, deep look on the subject.

Looking at his arguments he gives some compelling evidence why many of the ideas Liberal scholars will take against the Resurrection are often found lacking when real world applications of how evidence is used in a crime scene investigation are used. If you compare this work to Ehrman (as an example, but as any Christian who has spent more than 10 seconds on the Internet knows, these arguments are everywhere) who often makes the claim that he's using the same logic one would use in a trial to make the case against the Resurrection one might find Ehrman's argument lacking (and not to go all fleshy/natural on this one, but who are you going to believe about solving a crime, a detective or an academic, wait don't answer that). That being said this little book is worth a look.
