## **Book Addict Shaun says**

Book three of 2018 and I am on a bit of a roll with some great reads. The Towers is the first in a series and introduces us to brothers Mark and Matthew as they move onto the notorious estate. Natalie Hames portrays a brutal and realistic setting here with The Towers, the fear felt by the family at moving to the area being palpable. Despite being set in the 90s this unfortunately could all too easily be a story set in the present day because not much has changed for some of these tower blocks around inner city London. Danger comes from a number of places and each chapter left me wondering just what else could go wrong and what was about to happen for these characters.

The two brothers both make some risky choices throughout the story. One taking what he thinks to be the right path, and the other not so much. At the start I thought it'd be a story where we had one brother who turned to the police and one who was just an out and out criminal but surprisingly that wasn't the case at all. Both brothers actually act with the best of intentions and, usually, to protect the people that they love. I found that they were both likeable however for the sake of drama I am excited to see how things will progress for them in future books. The cast of characters is eclectic with your typical villains alongside some female characters who despite only playing small roles in the story, helped me to understand the actions of the brothers at times.

The story itself is gritty and Natalie doesn't hold back with her portrayal of the area or some of the things that the characters involved do. It's a gripping story that I had read in just a few short hours. It had that Top Boy (seriously if you missed it first time round get on Netflix now...) feel to it and the setting was brought to life and easily imagined in my mind. It is full of hateful characters but also some who are just trying to make the best of the hand that they have been dealt. Natalie doesn't shy away from making things as brutal as possible so there won't be any cliched happy endings here because whilst some things were tied up neatly for

some of the characters, I imagine the decisions made by some of them in this first novel will only come back to haunt them in the future.

I highly recommend this book if you are looking for a gangland type thriller which is able to be read over the course of one afternoon. Hopefully the rest of this series is just as good as I can't wait to read them and continue the story of Matthew and Mark and the characters that they have met along the way so far.
