For me, one of Jill Sorenson's greatest strengths as a writer is her ability to take deep dives into her characters. I felt so overwhelmed with these characters and their desperate desires to break out of cycle of violence. My heart kept breaking for Eric and his attempts to resist his old life - wanting to start fresh but being tempted again and again into his old life. This again reminds me that meritocracy is a myth. The belief that everyone starts at the same place and life and has the exact same opportunities to make choices is simply untrue. Some people are born into circumstances in which choices are more difficult and the price for those same choices are often higher.

The narrative is intense. I wondered how the author was going to resolve the issue with Eric and the gang members. I felt stressed throughout the entire story, especially because the author made the story real. Most of us do not deal with life and death situations everyday, but for some, the quest for survival is a daily battle. I thought Ms. Sorenson brought the story to a satisfying conclusion.

My one critique is that there are left over storylines that peaked my interest. I'm hoping that the author will consider writing additional stories for Junior and Kelsea. Crossing my fingers here.

I have stopped and started this book three times in as many weeks. I think it's safe to say that it's not working for me, when I have read the same chapter several times and nothing is really being absorbed.

To be honest it's not any one thing that has reduced my reading enjoyment to nil, but a whole host of them. Meghan and Eric didn't really inspire any real feelings for them either way, and I really, really struggled to find or pull any connection with them from the portion of the novel that I managed to read. I can deal with '*downtrodden*' and '*down on your luck*' characterizations, but I need to at least feel a modicum of empathy or sympathy for the people experiencing those things...

If you check out the blurb, it's leads the reader to believe that they are going to be getting a dark and gritty read, with lots of tension and forbidden feelings, a guy trying to make a new start and a girl looking to get started, and it just all felt really under-developed and superficial from the beginning, from the build up of the story-line to the filling out of the actual characters. Eric Hernandez grew up in the rough environment of street gangs where tagging walls and selling drugs were an everyday occurrence. He knows he's made bad choices, one in particular landed him in jail as a violent offender. But after three years in prison, he's out and disposed to live on the straight and narrow. It's not easy turning a new leaf, especially when your past is threatening to catch up and the only girl he's ever loved is now a tempting and completely off-limits woman.

“This is what straight life is about. Hard work and simple pleasures.”

Meghan Young had no other choice but to move on with her life after Eric's rejection when he was incarcerated. She continued with her college degree as a psych major, she even found a seemingly perfect athlete boyfriend. But looks can be deceiving and Eric's return unravels Meghan's barely there hold on her life. But even with the hardly contained attraction and emotions between her and Eric, can Meghan convince Eric to give himself and them a chance?

“She's different. She's still kind and caring and inquisitive, but different. More mature. The Meghan I knew back then was a small-town girl rebelling against her religious upbringing.

This Meghan is not so innocent, and all the more tempting.”

I've mentioned before that I love reading new authors and Jill Sorenson is a refreshing surprise. She was true to the difficult, tempting and distressing situations her characters faced from start to finish, not shying away from the complications of life after prison a young, toughened man who was no stranger to crime and gangs would have to face. Nor did she make Eric and Meghan's transition from a heartbreak young love to an adult, mature relationship smooth or easy.

Eric is not your typical anti-hero or charming, charismatic hero, a fact I loved. Even with the sexy hard edges surrounding an artist's soul, there was something that didn't let me fully connect with him. I wanted him to succeed though, so very much. He accepted his errors and never hid behind a victim card. It was sad to see him struggle to find a job, difficult to try to control his emotions and actions, stressful to see him try to keep out of trouble when trouble liked to visit him on a regular basis. I truly wanted him to find himself, his place and happiness.

“Back in the day I used to make fun of guys who got hung up on their girlfriends... There's nothing unmanly about wanting to keep your woman happy. It's a strength, not a weakness.”

Meghan, even though having an “easier” life compared to Eric, she still has to go through what most young adults do when transitioning from student to the real world. Add to that the fact that she was in love with a criminal while dating a less than perfect jock and you can surmise that her life wasn't that easy. I liked that she was strong enough to get out of her abusive relationship and that she saw beyond Eric's past, saw the good person lying underneath the exterior coarseness, and fought for what she wanted.

The chemistry between Eric and Meghan is palpable, not only to them and the supporting characters. It completely leaped off the pages.

“I've never been like that before, so rough and aggressive. Her passionate response surprised me. Not only did she enjoy my caveman act, she followed me into the shower.”

I loved all the secondary characters who not only supported Eric and Meghan, but also enhanced this story about hope and love with the support and strength of family and friends. I did some investigating and found out that Ms. Sorenson has previously written about Eric's sister-in-law and Meghan's brother in a novel called The Edge of Night, which I've already added to my read list, and I hope we'll soon get the story about Meghan's best friend Kelsea.

Jill Sorenson blew me away with her portrayal of a young Mexican-American struggling to go straight after gang life landed him in jail for manslaughter. Take away all the window dressing of a tepid romance and it was his personal story of struggle, survival, hope and redemption that was the heart of *Against the Wall*.

The first person narrative of Eric Hernandez was so real. I was inside his head. I was trembling alongside him every time a low rider ominously rode by, presumably trying to extract revenge for past sins.

I was sweating alongside him as he was given the most menial jobs and had to smile and be thankful because no one else would even give another chance to a felon so he had to shut up and bear it.

I looked at the world through his artist's eyes and stayed up all night right along with him sketching, mixing paints, creating beauty out of despair and pain and yes, even hope.

I was awed and frustrated and hopeful and pessimistic and forever shifting moods right along with him.

I was fighting the same urges, white-knuckling it, repeating my mantra of staying out of jail at all costs, calculating how far I would have to go before the willful destruction of my honor, my values, and my identity, completely reduced me to nothingness, all in the name of keeping the peace.

I don't know how she did it but Jill Sorenson lived inside a 20 something year old gang member's head and opened up his mind, heart and soul for me to live his experience.

It's harder than I thought, being free. It's overwhelming.

The plight of an ex-con going "free." So ironic because he had more freedom, respect, realistic expectations and structure in prison than on the outside, where he has to constantly fight so many urges and temptations. Going back to his friends, to the gang life. Getting embroiled in territory wars. Or letting down his family. Getting back into the system. Become another statistic. Yeah, freedom can be heavy, suffocating in fact.

"Do you want me to stay?" I ask him.

"No."

"You're all fucked up."

"I always will be."

This makes my eyes burn with a sudden, unstoppable rush of tears. Junior kept me alive in prison. He's had my back for years. And now I have to turn my back on him. There's no way we can continue to be friends.

Yeah, well, my eyes burned too, reading this book. It was really eerie how the author managed to make these characters come alive, manage to get to the heart and soul of these otherwise faceless statistics that are only good for selling headlines and illustrating political agendas.

Once in a while, you pick up a book on a whim and you are absolutely blown out of the water because it was not what you were expecting. This was one of those instances. I bow down to you Ms. Sorenson. You amazed me with this one.

Against the Wall was my first book by Jill Sorenson. It was a bit dark, a bit gritty, a lot sexy and really well written. While I think it can stand on its own, it was a follow up novel (which I wasn't aware of when I started reading). I kind of wish I would have read the first book so I could have seen more of Eric and Meghan's transition, though I was able to understand this story as it was.

Eric is out of prison after spending the last three years behind bars for killing another gang member in a knife fight. While it wasn't his knife and he was only doing it in self defense, he had a long enough list of crimes, he knew why he went away. Now living with his pseudo-brother's house with a girl that's like a sister to him and his niece, he's trying to keep his distance from Meghan. Before he went to jail, he and Meghan had a relationship which he viciously severed. Now Meghan has a rich boyfriend and he's trying to move on too by working at a tattoo shop. But his life seems to constantly revolve around Meghan and he's finding it difficult to stay detached.

Meghan loved Eric with all her 19 year old heart. Now three years later, she's still in love with him and finding her current relationship to be deteriorating. With Eric living with her brother, she can't get him out of her head. As they fumble around each other, sparks fly and so do their clothes. But Meghan can't seem to get behind Eric's facade and when she starts chipping away, she's not sure she likes what she finds.

This was a really well written, slow building love story. Even though I was missing some of their back story, I could feel the tension between them. I thought Eric's transformation seem realistic to his situation. There were times that I was a bit flustered with Meghan and her choices and attitude but she grew on me. This book was OK but I really felt like I was missing a part of the story. Meghan and Eric's history before he went to prison was very vague and I thought I was missing a piece of the puzzle. I had to go back and check because I thought that perhaps this was a sequel but no. It was hard to route for their forbidden love when I couldn't feel and didn't know the beginning of their story.

Eric was a hard character for me to like. He came across as an immature, horny teenager. I understand that he spent three years in prison but he came across as a young boy just discovering what his penis could do with no control over his hormones. It was not sexy on him at all. Meghan also came across as younger than she was and their relationship felt like it wasn't anything deeper than raging hormones on both parts.

I don't want it to sound like I hated the book because I didn't. I just think that there was a lack of emotion and feeling to the story that could have made it great. It was still entertaining but just didn't pull at my heart strings as much as I would have liked. For me, I needed the story before the story in order to appreciate it fully.
