This was the second book in this series my children and I have read together. My youngest two love the series. And for this book the oldest child and I took turns reading to the younger two. Making this series great for the whole family. As my children grow it is harder to find books that all three, girl, boy, girl like and will read together. It is wonderful that the oldest can help read to the younger two and that this book entertains all three. This series showed up in my recommended books because of reading some Dragon books by Chris d'Lacey and we gave them a try and there has been no looking back.

This second book in this series opens with fun and adventure, the dragons go out to fly. But things soon turn dark when Kepri the sun dragon becomes sick and almost falls from the sky. Soon the 4 dragon masters and their teacher Griffith are poring over books and scrolls trying to find a cure. Soon Worm the earth dragon reveals another of his abilities and the group is off to an adventure in Egypt. This is a story filled with spells, magic, a mysterious twin and more. A great tale.

The illustrations by Graham are wonderful, the help support the story without being too scary. The embellishments on almost every page add to the stunning presentation. And combine that with well written stories and the book and series is a big hit.

I cannot say enough how much my children love these books. They ask to read each night, and turn off the TV and devices in order to read earlier. They always ask for extra chapters. They even ask often when book 4 will be out and to see the cover of it. And what higher praise could be given to a book or series than children clamouring to read more, or read again. I think I would rather each book have more of a self-contained story, rather than being part of a larger, overarching storyline, because I have found that early chapter books are easier to "sell" to reluctant readers if they don't feel overwhelmed by something that requires a big commitment. In this book, Kepri, Ana's dragon, becomes seriously ill after getting hit by dark magic at the end of book 1. Her best hope is to be reunited with her Moon Dragon twin, location unknown. Fortunately, Worm is well-versed in the dragon population and is able to use his dragon powers to transport the Dragon Masters and their dragons to Egypt, where they meet Heru, the young boy who looks after Wati, Kepri's twin.

Kepri the Sun dragon is not looking very good. It appears the orb of dark magic the dragons and dragon masters encountered at the end of the last book has made her sick. Can Wizard Griffin and the dragon masters find a cure before Kepri gets worse and the King gets more upset?

Drake's dragon Worm continues to surprise everyone with his abilities in this one, and helps save the day along with some new friends in Egypt. The book moves at a good pace and keeps readers engaged with the plot points and the illustrations. It's an approachable read for kids just getting into chapter books, but also an entertaining plot with a nice cast of multicultural characters who have some depth, and some mysteries that span multiple books to keep readers coming back for the next book in the series. Perfect choice for lower grade fantasy/dragon fans.

A dragon gets sick and potions don't work to heal her. Worm, a dragon who can't fly, has special powers and takes her – and the young dragon masters – to the cure of the Sun Dragon's disease.

I love dragons! This is an excellent story full of dragons with different abilities.

I can't wait to read the entire series! I know, just reading for my inner-child. This book is appropriate for young readers (7-9 years), though I think that's more of a read-alone thing. If read aloud, I think it is more like 4-6.
