We have all the same ingredients as in the first volume, perhaps with a little more actual tension between the protagonists, even if that does not turn into something that makes a lot of sense. ("Tell me!" – "Are you sure you want to know?" – "Yes, tell me!" – "Okay, here's what I'm thinking..." – "OMG, you bastard, why did you tell me?")

Still, even as someone used to reading stories of instantaneous love, these books are giving me whiplash. Maybe love is just a word to throw around and not what I understand of it.

Anyway, I'm not going again into the issue of size concerning wolves and, in this case, tigers. And I will even less get into the white tiger thing. It's become almost a staple in shifter stories anyway. And in a world that contains shape shifters, who's to say that white tigers can't be a "species" among them? Have to make allowances for pure fantasy.

So yeah. Not sure if this is fluff, since it did not make me feel terribly fluffy, but it definitely does not hold back with emotional outbursts, easily dripping into melodrama.
