I liked the other men. There is one minor observation I do have with Dixie's writing. The way the characters use such proper grammar drives me a little crazy. People just don't talk that way. Even those with a higher intellect than average don't speak in complete proper sentences all the time. It's ok to use conjunctive words and slang. It isn't a business letter and – in my opinion – would be a lot easier to relate to if she loosened up on the proper grammar just a bit. Even with that said she still has an A+ from me.
