I somehow thought it would be much more of a fantasy book with the main characters going into Sandrine, the witch's, portal. I think the message of how to deal with the death of a loved one was a good one, but at the same time realize that how we deal with such a loss is something extremely personal. The story did touch on that a little, but did show that we are more alike in our emotions and dealing with loss. I didn't completely understand the use of figures representing the fears of the main characters, and why they were dealing with those. They seemed to mainly be the fear of video game characters. I think the fears could have been more varied and creative. I also felt they were mostly the fears of Lily and Austin, and could have included fears from Jeremy, Amelia and Holly. I found the idea of flashbacks to the death's an interesting idea, and for the characters to discover what they had missed in each situation, gave each a new perspective. Interesting book, even if not what I was expecting.
