This is easily the most unconvincing menage I have read since... & . Also, it's usually not a good sign when one day after completing a book, I can't remember the names of the main characters.

Wild Horses is the name of an "almost famous" band made up of three brothers and a friend. The story is told mainly from Corey's (lead singer and songwriter for the band) POV. Corey is a slut and is obsessed with turning straight guys, gay. Josh's POV is also provided. He is the band's bass player and lead guitarist. Josh and Corey have been best friends since childhood and fuck-buddies since puberty. Josh is also into straight guys. Then there is Travis, a "straight" actor who plays a "tween" on TV. We also get to see the story from Travis' POV.

My main issue with this story, is that neither Travis nor Josh, had shown any interest in each other, sexually or otherwise, prior to the meeting with Corey. To have Josh and Travis suddenly so into each other, three-quarters of the way through the story, was a disappointing ending to what should been a fun, rockstar romance, with sexually adventurous MCs. This was erotica, but it wasn't just plotless sex. The sex scenes here were hot and there were plenty of them. But I like a real plot mixed in with my sex and happily Wild Horses delivered; the sex evolved naturally from the story and forwarded the plot. The sex wasn't just fun to read, the sex scenes mattered and impacted story and character development. Furthermore, the sex scenes were varied and the author kept things interesting over the course of the book.

The characters were fun and likable without being perfect. If I can't enjoy the characters and the world they live in, I usually can't enjoy the novel. But that wasn't a problem here since the author created a world and situation which was a pleasure to experience.

The story summary mentioned "submission", and that made me nervous because I'm not into hardcore BDSM. In particular, I do **not** enjoy humiliation or abuse and too many times I've read stories where "submission" turns ugly and dark. But the sample seemed light enough that I risked it and I'm glad I did. The boys explored kink, but it was playful, sexy, and hot. If you want your boys beaten, gang-raped, and mentally broken, then look elsewhere.

I love seduction, and this novel provided it for me. Yes, seducing the "straight" boy has been written, but it is still fun. Watching Travis slowly let his inhibitions dissolve felt natural and was sexy to watch.

I also like that the story keeps a light tone. The author is aware of trite scenes we've seen a thousand times, takes us to the edge of that, and then makes a twist to keep it fresh and sometimes add a bit of humor.

So if you like stories of gay romance to have a plot and still include varied, steaming hot sex, pleasant characters, and a touch of humor, then I recommend this novel.
