Where do I start with “Enough”? Overall, I would say this is a heavy book with some quite triggering moments. We have a strong-willed teenager named Emily Vasquez who is still discovering herself. She's independent, smart, and at times a little insecure, but who isn't as a teenager?

This book is sitting at the middle with a good firm 2.5 stars from me. I struggled with what to rate it, debated it, because I felt torn. I loved the beginning. I fell in love with Emily and was beyond interested in her, and what her life was all about. She had secrets, she had doubts and yet she was still likable. The first 120 pages had me reeled in. Then... it started going down hill. Things stopped making sense and only seemed to serve purpose to the intended narrative than to the actual one. Like this all happens in a month, if even that, money problems are solved easily, swimming in the middle of winter, being released from the hospital without follow ups while others have to, sex sex sex without any inclination towards a trauma, and the excessive issues with the “Mary Sue” tendencies that Emily would portray. Like not being confident in her body yet being offered a modelling gig. Saying how she can't turn to anyone yet has a huge array of friends. Etc. There were aspects I enjoyed, but I felt like they were more at the beginning. Where the world was built up. Then, near the middle of the book, or slightly before the middle, the villain who first raped Emily is dealt with. There was a conclusion there... but it was just half way through and I felt so confused because afterwards the moments just dragged on forever and they served no purpose. Like the long dates, the group dates and the parents not at all involved when teenagers are doing the things these ones are doing. Moments that seemed rather pointless somehow became dominant in the story. And aspects that were seemingly rather important were resolved and removed. The book started to feel disconnected to me. I felt like I was reading three books at once. One dealing with a girl who is oblivious to the supernatural aspects in her life, dominantly in her best friend whom she dismisses as being weird. Okay, sure. Then a girl who is struggling to find her self when she has gone through so much tragedy in her life, who has kept very intense secrets

about herself and her past, from friends and family. Dealing with how this can affect your mentality and still be seen as a level headed woman. Okay sure! Then... it's said girl finding true love and realizing it's a big aspect she likes having, and coming to terms with the fact that each of them has a past. All of these things crammed together really left me confused because Emily changed too often to fit certain circumstances. I just... it bothered me! And my enjoyment of the book faltered heavily because of this. I can handle two inter-crossing stories, but not three. That's too many conflicting themes, in my opinion. Because of the ever changing path, things felt exceptionally convenient. Emily is told early on she has to move – but no that's resolved. How? Her boyfriend, who wasn't her boyfriend at the time and barely knew her, decides to donate them with, what? A 10 million dollar cheque? Emily feels like no one should know because then they'll think she's only with him for the money! Yet, his hot body, expensive car and huge house aren't already a give away. Too convenient. And the relationship felt too... forced? I don't know. Saying I love you after two weeks doesn't feel right, not in this context. You can't go through a trauma and fall in love at the same time. I don't believe our brains work that way...

Things were all around way to convenient, it had a very farfetched feel. Like the big summer incident. Not even the reader knows all the secrets, albeit being in Emily's perspective. She has a big secret from her summer with drugs and sex. Then randomly at the end, her friend is all "Remember that video!?" Well here's a link!" like it's so convenient. Not once has Emily mentioned her horrors being filmed, but when she wants to tell everyone at once, there is one. It just... I don't know, didn't feel organic. And that was my biggest gripe, is that a lot of moments in this book didn't feel organic. At times it was too dragged out and nothing happened that would make me interested again. I feel like I may pick up the others as well, but right now, I just lost too much interest. The author seems to have a way to drop clues only when you need them, not when they should be brought up. Ala at the end of the novel where Emily "should be on birth control". If she is as horny as she comes across, I would hope she was being safe the entire time. This only seemed to be brought up as a clue that leads to the bit where she says "I found something out about my body that is going to be great for us".

Overall, *Enough* is a book about a teenage girl with a severely tragic past. I had so many questions but I did enjoy the first half better than the second.
