In a trilogy, the second and third books normally aren't that good. But after reading "Lead Me On", the second book in the Pearl Island trilogy, I was wrong. I fell in love with this book the same way I fell in love with the first. The storyline was even more gripping than the first, urging the reader to find out what will happen next to the characters. This book was also very mysterious since many questions were left hanging but by the end, you understand everything.

Allison St Claire co owns the inn with her brother and sister. At this point in the novel, Rory and Chance have been happily married for a year and have a baby on the way. Allison is very different from her sister. Rory was always the joyful, optimistic one, having men fall at her feet wherever she went. Unlike her sister, Allison was sweet and funny but held back hurt and pain. Allison fell in love and got pregnant at the age of 16, then told the boy that she was pregnant and he told her to abort it. Distraught and wanting to keep her baby she ran home and told her older brother, who smashed the boys face. Soon after Allison suffered a miscarriage. All this affected the way Allison trusted someone.

Scott Lawrence is a writer and visits the inn for some relaxation to cure his writers block. But when he sees Allison, he goes into shock. He wanted fun, not commitment. So when he comes up with the idea of a one night thing, Allison agrees, but it doesn't seem to work out. The more they spend time together, be it at the inn or some place else, the more feelings grow - something that neither of them wanted to happen. As the relationship suffers its ups and downs, the two get closer but Scott missed out one detail he forgot to tell Allison - that he was born a LeRoche. The LeRoche's are enemies of the St Claires, going back to when Marguerite fell in love with Henri LeRoche. John LeRoche, Scott's father, has sued the St Claires for buying the inn and Allison gets really upset, making Scott defend his new friends at the inn instead of his family.

This story reminds me of Romeo and Juliet, and how two lovers cannot be together because of a name. This trilogy is really intriguing and such a fun read, I can't wait to see what the last one brings!

I really really wish I used to write reviews so I could understand the two star rating I originally gave this book... there had to be some reason behind it - but for the life of me I cannot think what it was as re-reading the book now I really enjoyed this!

In my review of the first book in the series (2014 review that is) I said I thought Allison's book was the third book in the series - totally wrong there. I also said I didn't like her characterisation in the epilogue but it makes total sense in light of this book - though as the epilogue in book 1 basically happens at the end of this book I do wonder if it would be better not to have had that epilogue... still. It does work.

Allison is again a well rounded character, as is Scott actually. I did recall as soon as he was introduced who exactly he was but was very glad that the book doesn't make a huge deal out of it - it was all very realistically done (I find a lot of chick-lit tends to dramatise things and it gets highly irritating after a while).

The... supernatural element is perhaps more emphasised here but isn't done so in an irritating manner.

All in all, a very solid middle book.
