Devin and his friend, Katey, go to find the pups before the squire can kill them. They succeed in hiding the three wolf pups for awhile but then the town bully, Paul Chandler, follows them to the hiding place. Paul tells the squire, and the two female pups are killed. Sdhoirm, the male, gets away. Devin hides Sdhoirm in his father's stable until the wolf is old enough to hunt. Then, with a heavy heart, Devin turns the wolf loose in the forest. The legend of Sdhoirm grows and grows. Each new tale makes him seem more ferocious and invincible than the last. Finally, one night Devin wakes up to find Sdhoirm in the stable. The book takes place during the late 1700s. This haunting tale contains wonderful imagery. The authentic dialect places the reader right in the heart of 18th century Ireland.
