Ariel is such an engaging character you want to be there giving her advice and guiding her path, and Chad is such a player you wonder if she isn't making a mistake. However, the chemistry between these two is electrifying and I enjoyed every minute of their repartee. If you like stories where there is both romance and sparks you will love War-N-Wit. The real and the paranormal mix in this fun romp and exploration of a woman's need to choose the right man for the rest of her life. Will she choose the staid and dependable Scott, her fiance or the wild and fly by night existence of Chad, the man she can't seem to get out of her mind.
