Besides, she enjoys her work at a farm to save money so she can go to vet tech school. And she's very keen on losing her virginity. In fact, she wants to explore all kinds of new feelings without restraints and is ready to "sin". Her plan seems to work when she sets her eyes on a specific and very sexy man who attends an auction at a fundraiser. It's badass SWAT officer Ben Harris who is sporting a flirtatious and dangerous smile and has *trouble* stamped on his forehead. Rachel pays a cool (view spoiler) to spend a nice evening with him. They fix a date, eat dinner and have sex. The morning after, however, Ben is stunned to find blood at the base of his dick and condom and he demands an explanation from Rachel.

He lowered his voice just a little. "I want an explanation. You want to do it again. Longer. Slower. Hotter. This time we'll both get what we want."

The story takes it from there, and what was intended to be educational, no-strings-attached sex becomes something more; something intense and complicated.

Heat rose in the golden brown depths, transforming them into aged whiskey. When her soft pink lips parted, he couldn't help himself. He bent and kissed her, lightly at first, using heat and the merest pressure to tempt her to open to him, then touched the tip of his tongue to hers. Minor quibbles

Throughout the entire book I so wanted to see Ben cuddle with Rachel. Darn, it didn't happen until the end. In any event, the header of the story is more like *sizzling hot sex lessons on Sundays, no cuddling included* anyway. That's the reason I "only" gave this book 4.5 stars. Then again I shouldn't complain at all because Anne portrayed Ben realistically. Ben's behavior reflected his character and it took him a while to change his habits which was fine by me. Ultimately, the love weaseled its way into Ben's life towards the end of the plot. Irrevocably.

We shouldn't forget either that at its core *Uncommon Passion* is an erotica book with plenty of panty melting and absolutely fabulous sex scenes.

I think the cover doesn't reflect the story in the least. I would have chosen something way more erotic and sensual; maybe a man and a woman, probably something in black and white. There is nothing more beautiful than a black and white cover that depicts a couple in the throes of passion. Sorry, but when it comes to black and white photography I'm clearly biased. :)

While I wasn't a fan of the first sex scene I must confess it was authentic and could have happened this way in real life too. I will, however, stick to my opinion that *Uncommon Passion* contains the best sex scene that Anne has ever written. What happened at 54 % left me totally breathless and stunned. A perfect symbiosis of passion, want, need, sensuality and awareness--heart and soul aligned. This scene was absolutely perfect in its white-hot intensity. It's kinda odd because I can't really describe what happened there and then. Even though they didn't love each other yet, it was so much more than sex. Geez, the whole thing ended with Ben being thoroughly shaken to his core. So, so beautiful. I can't tell you how much I loved and treasured this scene. Rachel took him apart with her fingers, mouth, tongue and her entire body.

I marvel at Anne's writing skills; what a heady flavor!

It's amazing how Anne orchestrates the sex scenes. There is so much pulsating energy that will make you feel giddy, wanton and alive. Hell, Ben can push me against a wall any day--I'm game, you sexy beast! Anne's writing is voluptuousness pure because she makes you feel all kinds of intricate emotions. Witnessing the level of **sensuality, eroticism and emotion** that this story provided was incredibly delicious. I just wanted to wallow in it and...just feel. That's exactly what distinguishes her erotic stories from plain ole porn. Anne has a way to heighten my awareness, to make me want to soak up every word she writes. Due to the fact that she accomplishes to put so much emotion into her words, her stories have a great forward movement; it's addictive, once I start to read one of her books, it's hard to put down again.

Ben's uniform *is* his shield and it gets him women. Lots of women, actually, and lots of meaningless sex. Yet the sex only feeds his resentment and anger. I was frustrated over Ben's obstinacy several times, yet I was rooting for him when he finally, *finally*, came around. There is nothing better than a tough man dealing with his fears and shortcomings and falling down on his knees eventually. Imagine a suitcase filled with stones. That's exactly what Ben was lugging around for the last fourteen years, and when you have such a heavy load to deal with, not everything will be sunshine and roses only because a wonderful and pure woman steps into your life. It's a process that takes time. What happened with Ben when he met Rachel is, in a sense, comparable to the five stages of grief. Denial and Isolation. Anger. Bargaining. Depression. Acceptance. I won't lie, Ben is very hard to love. And even though it took such a long time for him to show openly that he is an all-around great man, someone who cares so deeply, it was so worth waiting for. The longer the wait the sweeter the reward, because the final 10 % were incredibly beautiful, romantic and filled with the good kind of sweetness.

Rachel was a *remarkable* heroine, definitely no whiny wallflower at all and a quick study. Ben can tell you a thing or two about it. In spite of her religious background she wasn't the helpless victim, and she wasn't someone who we should pity either. If anything, she showed her true qualities when she took Ben apart. She is strong and empathic. Although she lacked experience in many areas of life, she is a rather perceptive woman, and after a while she looked right through Ben's armor. What I also loved about her was the fact that she wasn't afraid to stand up for herself, to voice her opinion and to make demands. Rachel really knew what she wanted out of life and worked hard to achieve her goals.

**I got really hurt** in my heart a few times and it felt pretty cold here and there. Ben is not among the most lightly flirted and sympathetic guys and Rachel was very targeted. So the date rolls around and the act is everything **BUT** hot. Rachel doesn't divulge her little secret and Ben is none-the-wiser. Until the following morning and oopsie Rachel left a little something-something behind. Ben confronts Rachel all kinds of angry demanding answers.

And now we have a new little arrangement. In exchange for answers as to (a)why Rachel is still a virgin and (b)why she didn't tell him she was a virgin, Ben is willing to "teach" Rachel everything there is to know about sex.

Where can I sign up for some of these lessons??

Ben and Rachel agree to keep emotions out of it and keep it sex only. They meet every Sunday for a sex session. Rachel's confidence grows with each meeting. She was so sheltered in the ~~entire~~ commune...not allowed to feel things or want things....have desires and such. Ben is providing a whole new world of emotions for her.

Now Ben himself is emotionally closed for business. After some family drama with his dad and brother, Ben lives life on the edge. Not letting anyone in, refusing to put himself out there for fear of being hurt again.

Eventually the lines get blurry.....Rachel wants more from Ben but until Ben can come to terms with what happened with his brother, he can't be what Rachel needs. The way Rachel makes him feel scares poor Ben and he eventually pushes Rachel away.

I really loved everything about this story. It brought out so many emotions. Rachel's life at Elysian Fields was **SO** heart-breaking. And she was such a kind, caring person. This is a book about a woman who wants to feel and a man who needs to let go of his anger and live in the present. Together they have explosive chemistry, and passion but there are also periods of sadness and grief. Anne Calhoun is truly a master at writing erotic romance.

Before I begin let me stress – this is not a romantic suspense book despite the cover. This is a deep, erotic contemporary romance. Too bad the cover does not portray this.

Rachel is a twenty-five year old virgin who had lived her entire life in a strict religious compound called Elysian Fields Community of God. A very isolated place where Rachel had to wear long skirts, was expected to marry and have lots of babies, and also was not allowed to show anger or sadness. She was expected to always show joy, and she couldn't take it any longer. So one day she withdraws money out of

her joint savings account with her father, and escapes the compound. She finally ends up working for a farmer in Texas, as she has vast experience with goats and such from growing up. She has made a list of things to do and to try – new foods, new clothes, listen to music, drink alcohol. But she also wants to try sex so when her farm has a charity event and they auction off bachelors to raise money, she becomes completely spontaneous and bids on a sexy police officer.

Ben works for the SWAT team and has gone through his fair share of women. He knows from the look in Rachel's eye, his date will end in the bedroom and that is fine by him. What he didn't expect is to find out the next day that she is a virgin. A virgin who had never even kissed or touched a man until she had been with him. Feeling like a bum, Ben tracks Rachel down at the farm to make amends, which leads him to showing Rachel sex a little more gently. Their sessions start to become a Sunday event, as Ben decides to prepare Rachel to handle men in the real world. He opens her eyes sexually, but not to be outdone – Rachel starts to change Ben's life. All Rachel wanted to do was to feel honest feelings – her own honest feelings. Ben, estranged from his father for throwing his gay brother out of the house at a young age, has many issues to work through, and when faced with them...he must decide what kind of life the future holds for him, and it scares him.

We've all read a book with a virgin heroine and a playboy hero and blah blah blah. But this is not that book. This is a book of an extraordinarily strong woman, who yearns for new experiences. She is naïve to an extent but more so – she is matter of fact. She doesn't show her emotions, a result of her upbringing, but she just takes everything in stride. She is analytical, as she absorbs people's reactions and actions – she sits back and thinks things through before proceeding. And then she starts to feel:

Shame should be making itself known now. She'd lain with a man outside the bounds of wedlock, without even a relationship. He was essentially a stranger. She should feel ashamed, but she drove through the darkness back to the farm with only a rising fury for company.

They'd kept this away from her. Her father, her pastor, all the male leaders of the community, the women who guided and taught her had kept this intimate, vibrant, shocking thing from her, and that made her furious.

When in the bedroom with Ben, she is able to truly be honest with herself and her feelings. And you guys – this book is so damn sexy. There is a lot of sex, and it's hot and erotic and well done. Sometimes the sex was so intense I may not have breathed, sometimes it's more playful:

He tugged experimentally, and to his total shock the knots held. He'd expected girl knots.

When he looked up into her face, that small smile was back.

"I tie up goats," she said conversationally. "Goats are escape artists. I'm good at knots."

No fucking doubt, because she'd tied his guts in knots. His heart rate careened between full stop and red zone. He didn't say anything, felt his face going blank as the realization hit. He'd seriously underestimated Rachel Hill.

You think Rachel is the one that has a huge transformation to go through in this book, and she does to an extent. At the end of the book, Rachel is living a new life but she is still Rachel. But really, Ben is the one with more of an impact. Ben is more of a broody hero, who finds himself going back to Rachel again and again, but he has a big wall up around himself. He has such anger and guilt over past events with his family,

The book draws you in from the first page, and the words will weave their way all around you, making sure you experience everything along with the characters; every smell, every feeling, every sound, every passionately erotic moment. Anne doesn't write simple erotic romances.

I have fallen in love with her writing since reading *Liberating Lacey*, my first book by her. And I have been singing her praises every book since. I have yet to read a book by Miss Calhoun that I haven't enjoyed, and this one was no exception. Dare I say this was her best book yet? Well it was definitely a favorite of mine.

I loved everything about this book; the story, the characters, the writing.

What I have grown to love most about Anne's writing, is the way that she is able to write a heroine that strong, but in this incredibly endearing and understated way.

Rachel has recently left the only life she has ever known inside a restrictive religious community. She may be sheltered and a virgin, but she knows what she wants and she goes after it. She wants to experience life without limitations, she wants to feel, to truly live; like a butterfly taking flight after leaving the strict cocoon that was her upbringing.

The first thing she wants to experience is passion. When she meets the sexy Swat Officer Ben Harris at a bachelor auction, she knows that he is the perfect man to give her what she wants.

Ben is a broken and jaded man, trying to bury his pain in an endless haze of adrenaline jags at work, drinking, and sex.

He's not looking for forever, he's not even looking for next week. All he cares about is the here and the now. But when he learns that Rachel is a virgin after their one night together, he sets out to make amends. He knows he can't offer her much, but what he can offer her is a no string attached sexual education and not lose her heart in the process.

Everyone was worried Rachel would get her heart broken if she didn't get a ring and a vow and a happily ever after right out of a movie. But Rachel needed something more, something he didn't know if he could give her. She had no shields whatsoever to protect her from anything.

Including him. The only thing he could teach her was how to harden her heart.

Rachel never imagined that this is what she was missing; this lust, this burning hot passion that sets them both on fire.

Ben may have been detached in his life and relationships, but he was certainly not detached when it came to teaching Rachel the darker parts of passion.

Just say cock."

"I don't use language like that." He paused as if he were going to pull out, but then didn't. Ensnared in need, she moaned and squirmed again. "Try ride me. Pound into me. Make me scream. Or go for the one that means all three. Try fuck me."

The sex scenes in this book, while beautifully written, were also scorching hot.

Ben was definitely rough around the edges and loved things dirty and hot.

Should have made you be quiet while you took my cock deep inside?" She shook her head, as much response to the tumultuous cascade of sensation his words set off as negating his interpretation. "Should have stopped?" The whisper was dark, taunting. "Not gonna stop, Rachel." Two fingers slid inside her when he spoke, and a breathless little cry escaped her lips. "I want it right now, right the fuck now, against this wall now."

All Ben wanted to do was to teach Rachel about sex, and have a little fun with her while staying his jaded and detached self. But he begins to see that she is not quite what he expected

People assumed virgin meant weak, naïve, insecure, even ashamed. Not Rachel. She was aware, thinking about what she did and why she did it, and strong enough to ask questions, plan, execute a course of action that left her alone in the world.

Rachel may have been sheltered, but she was not your typical virgin that you might read in a book. She had a backbone, she stood up for what she believed. But the way she went about doing it is what made her so endearing to the reader. She had a quite intensity to her. She didn't scream, she didn't cry, she didn't make stupid decisions. She remained true to herself and her desires for life throughout the whole story, and I absolutely loved that about her.

Ben begins to see that there is a whole lot more to Rachel than the naive virgin he first thought her to be.

Rachel was wrong with him. Rachel and her dark hair and golden eyes and her ability to shine a light on the protective shield he held up between himself and the world. Just showing him it was there, let alone what it meant, or how thin it really was. Making him feel things he didn't want to feel.

Can Rachel get past his defenses to the beautifully broken man inside? Will Ben allow her past his walls and into his heart without breaking hers in the process?

Loved, absolutely loved this book. If you have never read a book by this author, this is the perfect one to start with. You will fall in love with the characters and the story.
