This book has pretty much the same premise as the first. Kent Harbinger, an ex-special agent with the FBI, has a penchant for thinking like, then catching serial killers. Once he became an ex-special agent, he attached himself to a police detective squad, and continues hunting serial killers. What happens after that? Hum. Well, something interesting, you know.

Ruben, who has been in love with Nicole since, as he admits, the minute he laid eyes on her, is getting over her. He met a meter maid in the 1st Cycle, and is now engage to her. Only, he has a serious problem with her. Serious.

After reading the next few books in the cycle, this does NOT end on a cliffhanger. It is finished, and very satisfactorily. Kent, Nicole, Ruben, and the JJs are extremely good as a team. Although Ruben has threatened to move elsewhere because he cannot stand to see Nicole married to Kent, Harbinger talks him out of it. Yes, you read that correctly. Wonders.

The first of the next two stories, originally left out (but promised as an update which didn't work until the author contacted Amazon), were the best of the bunch. Debbie Downer has an ending you may not see coming. Until it comes and you slap your head because, well, of course. To say anything else will be a spoiler.

The next big story, Cry Baby, literally had me holding my breath. Now, Ms. McCray does that to me a lot, but this particular story really freaked me out. I could not put it down, not to kiss my daughter goodbye as she left for work, not to tell my husband I didn't WANT breakfast (which I got and forgot to eat), not for anything. Even when my major Kindle's battery died, I picked up another one, fully charged, and continued. I must say this is the best of her police procedurals (although I haven't finished the Darc cycles yet, who knows?), and for that reason, GET THIS SERIES!

Greedy reader/fan that I am, I would love to see more of the JJs, but I'm sure Ms. McCray/Mr. Hopkin are really ready for more. Caveat: although the cover on the book currently shown on Amazon has SoHo Slasher on it, which is the prequel to International Hunters, it is not contained in the updated version of the book I just read. I was told, eventually, but not just yet.

PLEASE do not skip the shorts between the stories or the last little short at the end. These really, truly are

important to the cycle! I will say, as I said in my original review (which is deleted, by the way, LOL, and replaced by this one) the delectable shorts that are prequels to her other books (in this case, including the Mayflower series, which is also no longer available) are worth reading. Since this is the second time I've read this particular cycle, I've read those shorts and have ended up getting the full series. Do so. It's worth it!
