I received Cowboy at Arms as an ARC (advance reader's copy) book from NetGalley. The gifting did not determine the review/rating, which reflects my honest opinion. I really enjoyed the plot and the characters up until the last chapters when the hero devolved (due to circumstances), which may feel appropriate for some readers, but I thought Dusty acted atypical to his character; kinda messed up the ending for me. My copy wasn't a final version, so I'll hope the final edit addresses the overabundant use of the word "that", which is one of my pet peeves, especially for seasoned authors.

Good addition to the series. This time it is Dusty's story. He is the best friend of Forest, from Cowboy Under Fire. We learned in that book that Dusty has a pretty big crush on Trisha, one of the diner waitresses. In this book he finally works up the courage to ask her out.

Trisha has kept pretty much to herself, just working and taking care of her son. She came to Bitterroot while running from her ex, who she believes is responsible for the deaths of her best friend and her mother. She is constantly looking over her shoulder, expecting him to show up at any time. She has started to relax a little, and going out with Dusty is her first step to resuming a normal life.

I loved Dusty. Like all of the cowboys at the ranch, he has a turbulent past. He was raised by an abusive father, leaving emotional scars that still affect him. I loved his hints of vulnerability as he tried to work up the courage to ask Trisha out, and his nervousness when he finally did so.

The development of their relationship was really sweet. Dusty is so careful to treat her with respect and his own brand of cowboy honor. I also liked the way that he immediately made her son Cooper an important part of the relationship. There were some really wonderful scenes of Cooper and Dusty together, as Dusty became the father figure he wished he had had himself. When the appearance of an apparent stalker freaked Trisha out, Dusty's protective instincts kicked in. I loved seeing the way that he took charge of her safety and that of her son. Trisha has spent so long doubting herself because of one bad relationship that she's a little extra cautious around Dusty. It didn't take her long to realize she could trust him. I loved seeing her allow herself to lean on him, as he gave her the courage to stand and fight rather than run again. I also enjoyed seeing the two grow closer as they shared the traumas of their pasts and began to hope for a better future. Things are moving along quite well until something happens that brings all of Dusty's insecurities flooding back and he tries to pull away. I loved seeing Trisha decide to stand up and fight for what she wants, and

Dusty's reaction when she does. The epilogue was sweet.

The suspense of the story was good. There are two mysteries running through the book. The first is the mystery of the seven bodies that were found on the ranch. This one will run through the series. The investigation is at a bit of a standstill as there have been no new clues found. That is, until Dusty pulls up a skull at the end of his fishing line and it turns out to be the one missing from the collection of bones under the shed. However, there is nothing that indicates how it got into the pond. The police chief is frustrated but determined to solve the crime. I currently have two frontrunners in my suspicions, so we'll see if I'm right about either of them.

The second mystery is that of who is stalking Trisha. There are multiple suspects, from her ex to assorted customers at the diner. Trisha's fears for her safety and that of her son are real, especially after someone breaks into her hotel room and destroys it. As the attacks escalate, she fears more for Dusty's life than her own, as she's sure that she has brought danger to him. The occasional glimpse into the stalker's point of view only serves to increase the sense of danger. The final confrontation was intense, with an unexpected twist in the identity of the stalker. Help in finding Trisha also came from a truly unexpected source.

The story wraps up my mind with small town charm, as an adorable, yet nervous cowboy, wants to ask the girl for a date. From there it proceeds to be the sweetest, most loving, darling story of love, overcoming your past demons, a little Duke, and danger mixed into the bundle.

I have enjoyed this series from the start, and it seems to just get better with every story. The characters in the book are lovable, lovely, and real. The dates Dusty and Trisha have are filled with the wonder of falling in love, finding your soulmate, and someone to laugh with. The passion they have for each other is absorbing, but yet they want to wait for the perfect moment, to fulfill their need for each other. They share the past pain and, the horror they have experienced, they support each other, and are there for each other when needed. These two made me smile from ear to ear.

And then Cooper, the little John 'the Duke' Wayne wannabe! His three and half year old enthusiasm and joy for life, cowboys, and Dusty stole my heart. There's a couple of moments when he is imitating the Duke, that had me laughing out loud. Cooper and Dusty together were so perfect, like made for each other. The cowboy who has never known the love of a father, pours into this little man everything he ever dreamed of having, while growing up.

But the story is not all sweet and lovely, there are dangerous elements, events that put many lives in danger, a deadly obsession, that could put a stop for the future Trisha, Dusty, and Cooper are dreaming about.

Let me start by saying that I'm a Carla Cassidy fan, have been following this series, which I've very much enjoyed, and I've been looking forward to reading Dusty's story, and getting more clues to the mysterious skeletons found on Holiday Ranch. Having said that, I must admit that this fourth novel in the series, wasn't quite as good as I was expecting it to be.

When Dusty finally gets the nerve up to ask diner waitress, Trisha, out for a drink after her shift is over, she readily accepts, and the two seem to hit it off. She's keeping secrets though, and although repeatedly asked out by other men in town, Dusty is the only man she's agreed to see after hours.

Dusty, like all the other cowboys at Holiday Ranch, has issues. Like many of them, he grew up in a horrid, abusive household from which he ran away at age 13, and it's not something he readily discusses, but there seems to be real chemistry between these two, and the relationship slowly builds until the night he brings Trisha back to the motel room in which she's been living with her young son, Cody, only to discover a mug full of wildflowers and a note outside her note. Trisha is ready to flee town at the mere sight of it, and Dusty needs to find out why having a secret admirer is so traumatic for her. When she gives him a half-baked story about having once been stalked, he buys it, at least at that point--but there will be another gift, and a longer explanation to come. Meanwhile, their relationship grows, Cody adores him, and Dusty and Trisha are falling hard for each other.

While having a daytime picnic at the ranch on their day off, and teaching Cody how to fish at the pond, Dusty catches more than he bargained for when what's on the end of his hook is a skull--one that was missing from the previously discovered remains on the property, and so the mystery continues.

These are well-drawn characters, as I've come to expect from this author, and there are lots of potential suspects. When Dusty, after hearing the real reason for Trisha's fear, moves her and her son to the ranch for their own safety, there are several more incidents that make everyone wary. Through it all, Dusty is Trisha's rock, her safe harbor, which is why what would have been a 5-star review turned into a 4-star review near the end of the novel, and without giving away the ending, I can only say that I don't understand why Ms. Cassidy felt it necessary to have Dusty wimp-out and pull back, but it just didn't ring true to the character she created, at least not for this reader.

It's still a very enjoyable and suspenseful read, and until the mystery is solved, I'll remain hooked on this series--it's a good one.
