The last of his friends to marry, he feels he will remain alone and is not worthy to be loved. That included Lady Alyse Barrington, the sister of Gerry's good friend Hunter who had always had an attraction to him. When Gerry and Alyse are thrown together due to circumstances at his estate, Alyse is determined to help him move forward and see the light. When a madman from his past seeks retribution from Gerry, he begins to realize that he can start to let go some of his demons and find happiness. This is my favorite trope, that of the wounded hero, because it is wonderful to see them be redeemed by a love that will last forever. Another wonderful story by Arietta Richmond, which is part of her series "His Majesty's Hounds" but can be read as a stand alone book.

Another wonderful story in this series. Gerald "Gerry" Otford, Baron Tillingford, is not truly happy. He thinks himself unworthy of any woman and that includes Lady Alyse Barrington, the sister of Gerry's good friend Hunter, Duke of Melton. This was difficult to review. I sympathized with Gerry in that he was obviously suffering with post traumatic stress. But, it became obvious that what had caused it had been blown up in his mind excessively. The story was never clear enough on this point. We never did learn exactly what he did but there must have been some pretty bad stuff if it 'broke' the prisoner. Of course, we are talking of a time when life was much crueler. People didn't react with horror at things that we couldn't countenance today. This is what makes me question this point. The men of that era were more inured to pain in others than we are today. So we just have to accept that Gerry was an anomaly for his time, a man with a conscience.

Alyse was the perfect young lady for him. With her artistic eye she was able to see past the surface to the man inside. She drew him as she saw him, without the pain and bitterness. Why he thought that she would repudiate him if she knew what he had done in the war was puzzling since this was an era where women expected men to be men and not to have finer feelings. Still this is a romance, a story where reality is suspended and all is forgiven.
