Joining the battle over the Immortal Tain and against the demon Kehksut/Amadja/Culsu/presumably others are the Immortal Kalen and the water witch Christine. Kalen has been collecting art and trying to be an artist himself for the last 700 years, and has fallen under the spell of a half-Sidhe muse who wants his immortal soul for herself. Christine paints watercolors, and apparently is a better muse than the leanan-sidhe.

I was well pleased with this third volume by as many authors in the Immortals series. Joy Nash is quite on par with the other two and my apprehension that one or more of the other authors of this series would be less talented than the first has been alleviated. Although Nash's work seems to contain more sex than the other two, it didn't suffer overmuch, and was actually quite good. Nash is a descriptive writer, but her word choices were not as cringe-worthy as a lot of authors who are heavy on both sex and adjectives.

I liked Christine as a character quite a lot, but Kalen was a little more controlling and 'Alpha' than I prefer romance heroes to be. I am most intrigued by Mac, son of the Sidhe queen Niniane and the sea god Lir. I hear one of the upcoming volumes in this series is his story and am quite excited to read it.

This is a multi-author series along the lines of the 2176 series and the Crimson City series. The general premise is that there is an unbalance of light & dark magic in the world - tilted toward the dark side. Five immortal warrior brothers are responsible for stepping in to protect the balance when this happens, but this time one brother is on the side of evil and the other four have been missing for centuries. Throughout the world, members of the Coven of Light must find the remaining brothers and band them together to fight the evil that is encroaching over the land.

This third book in the series features the warrior, Kalen and Christine, the witch who finds him (and falls in love with him, because this is a paranormal ROMANCE, after all). As usual, they're up against Tain, the brother who went over to the dark side, and his demon master, who goes by a different name in each book. There's also a fun art theme running through this particular book and visits to the European cities of Rome, London, Inverness & Edinburgh with lots of local color from each.

I enjoyed a lot about this book. I liked the pairing of Christine & Kalen. I loved the art theme. And there are some great secondary characters introduced, one of which is a feature in a later book in the series. I'll definitely be picking up the next in the series.

Similar series IMO, are Gena Showalter's Lords of the Underworld and (to a lesser extent and with vampires) Ward's Black Dagger Brotherhood and possibly Kenyon's Dark-Hunter series (though I haven't read enough of those to be sure).

Christine Lachlan is water witch and an artist who has joined the Coven of Light, a force against the evil sweeping across the land. She must seek out Kalen, one of the five goddess-born Immortals, who has long been in hiding from the modern world. She will do whatever it takes to convince Kalen to assist them in defeating the force behind this evil, Kalen's own brother, the youngest Immortal, Tain.

Kalen has long since withdrawn from the world after a grave act on his part that will condemn him should he ever lose control again. Now his solace is his art, or it would be if he could only grasp the talent he once had. Even taking a leannan-Sidhe muse to his bed does not help him master his talent. When Christine enters his world, insisting he is needed to go to war, his art suddenly takes new form and his talent soars once more.

Kalen will do almost anything to keep Christine at his side as his muse. If only it were that easy. His former lover is vindictive and will do anything to get rid of Christine so she can steal Kalen's power. Kalen refuses to pick up his spear once again and cannot reveal his dark secret to Christine. Can these two reluctant lovers come together in time to defeat the newest and most pressing danger and accept The Awakening?

I love the whole premise of the Immortals series and have been eagerly anticipating the series since I first heard about it. The third book, The Awakening by Joy Nash is the first I've read and let me tell you this story packs a magical punch! What we have here is a compelling combination of loveable characters, a strong storyline, old secrets, and more magic than you can shake a spear at. Even not having read the books in order did not affect my enjoyment of this story. Yes there is an underlying story that arcs through the entire series but each one stands alone as well and I loved reading about Kalen and Christine. Joy Nash gives enough back story to fill in the blanks so I don't feel like I missed anything crucial.

Christine's gift is enhanced by water but is still not as strong as many others in her coven. This is partially due to a tragedy in her recent past that has scarred her emotionally and magically, making it harder for her to maintain her faith in her powers. But she tries very hard to overcome past events and focus on her current mission... finding Kalen and convincing him to aid the Coven of Light in defeating Death Magic. Kalen is weary of life in these modern times, preferring to live without all the modern benefits technology provides. He also suffers in his own private hell over events in his past which, if he isn't careful, can condemn him once more. When these two tortured souls come together, nothing can keep them apart, even the very embodiment of greatest evil.

The secondary cast of characters also makes an imprint on the story. From the beautifully seductive but vindictive and cruel Leanna to loveable teenaged (or is he really?) Mac, gruff and odd-looking but kind housekeeper Pearl to a whole passel of brownie servants. And these are just a few of the assorted magical creatures we encounter on the adventure of The Awakening.

In short, Joy Nash has written another beautifully told story of love and magic. You will not be disappointed.

I didn't believe the romance for one second. I bought the initial attraction and thought it was really cool how they first 'met,' and I totally dug every second of Kalen's caveman like tendencies, immensely, but as for being and falling in love, it was simply too quick; a common trend in this series. I'm not bellyaching about the romance though. The pace and believability were inconsequential to me liking or disliking the book. I love highlander romance, which in many ways this is. This book offered a story that diverged from the others since it deals with Celtic creatures, in a different country and with a different background, but it stayed true to the plot design of the entire series. I liked this book well enough and LOVED Kalen. I love the high-handed, alphas, I do!

Kalen lives in a castle in Scotland with no modern amenities. He wears a kilt, employes/befriends lots of different magical kind (brownies, Sidhe, halfings, etc.) and lives a quiet yet, individual existence. He loves the arts and has amassed an unbelievable collection of priceless masterpieces. He longs to create his own masterpiece which is why, for the last decade he has maintained an intimate relationship with a half human, half Sidhe muse, named Leanna. Yet, even after all these years, Kalen recognizes that something has always been missing. Then during one of his pairings with Leanna, he looks down and notices that the she is gone and in her place is a raven haired beauty with an indigo streak in her hair. She's there only a few seconds but it's long enough for him to sketch her. The sketch is a disappointing disaster but he remembers the woman and notices her instantly when he sees her again, this time at Leanna's Sidhe Sex Magic tour. Christine a skylad, water witch (the witch in Europe who helps uncover the Calling spell from book #1) who accidentally transported herself into Kalen's bed while scrying for him. After the unsettling event she sets out from Rome to Scotland to find Kalen and convince him to join their cause in Seattle. It's a long, troubling trip but she meets a young Scot named Mac along the way who knows how to get to Kalen's castle simple by looking at Christine's drawing. When Christine interrupts Leanna's sex program and accuses her of invoking dark magic, Kalen has to transport her away before the grudge holding Sidhe kills her. Kalen takes her to his castle and they pretty much get busy immediately. After that Kalen is determined to keep her at any cost and if the world is to end then he vows to take to Annwyn (home of the Sidhe) and have Lir (King of the Sidhe) give Christine immortality. So Kalen captures and keeps Christine, refusing to let her go. He isn't interested in fighting for humankind or the world. He is willing to help magic kind get to Annwyn and he'll do anything to make sure Christine is there too.

We learn eventually that Kalen was created by Cerridwen for the sole purpose of protecting the Tyrrhenus line of the Etruscans. Once their line dies out, Kalen refuses to continue to fight for anyone which is why he doesn't respond to the Call. There's actually much more to his story but he needs to give you the details, not me.

Kehksut/Amadja is back and this time called Culsu. He has a history with Kalen which is a part of Kalen's big secret. Tain is also present but plays a very small role and he's as lost as ever. And now Culsu uses Leanna and brings her into their evil ranks. Leanna is the unacknowledged daughter of Niniane, Queen of the Sidhe and a Scottish highlander. She has some mommy issues and thinks that an immortal baby, sired by



Kalen, is her ticket to all the things she wants. So calls on Culsu, knowing his/her history with Kalen, and invokes death magic into the conception plan and becomes a demonwhore. Demonwhores are explained a little more as Christine also has a history with them.

This story introduces the reader to a host of new magic kind. There are the Sidhe, Unseelies, brownies, gnomes, zombies, golems, sorcerers, merfolk, Selkies, faeries, leprechauns, ogres and pookas as well as the Gates of the Otherworld which lead to their home in Annwyn.

I liked this one and felt like Tain's sacrifice and what he's gone through are the worst of all the brothers so far. I'm mean Tain's past is awful, but Kalen's was so sad to me. I'm eager to move on to the next book. Can't wait to get to Tain.
