The story idea behind this novel is actually quite interesting. Ronnie Adler is currently down in the dumps regarding both her job and her love life. She goes on her dream trip to Athens, Greece in hopes of lifting her mood, but after a horrible accident, she finds herself on a mysterious island called Seulmonde that has many unexplained secrets. Slowly, Ronnie begins to understand what friendship, family and romance really mean to her, as she interacts with the people of Seulmonde.

The above description is solely based on the 30% of this novel that I did read. Contrary to the interesting synopsis on the back of this book, I thought this novel's characters and plot were seriously lacking in the depth and development department. Even without the cringe-worthy insta-love between Ronnie and almost every male character she meets, many parts of this novel were just too slow and undeveloped. There were many scenes starring Ronnie simply eating or sleeping or talking about topics unrelated to the plot as a whole that left me more than a bit disappointed. Also, there were a few long, awkward blocks of quotes (almost a full page) between characters without any sign of who was speaking. It was confusing and not very enjoyable to go through. But I think the most important part is that the characters weren't very relatable. I honestly cannot say I felt that many of Ronnie's, her ex-boyfriend's or Shelby's actions and reactions were realistic or even emotionally possible.

I'm really not trying to trash this novel though. There were some enjoyable parts. The whole idea of a mysterious island called Seulmonde that practically radiates beauty and togetherness was wonderful. And I really liked the fact that Ronnie didn't want to settle for a hush-hush relationship when she could go out and find a great guy that could be completely open and unashamed about their relationship. Also, I was pretty surprised by how quickly the story dove right into Seulmonde and Ronnie's problems, so there are no complaints at first about the pace of the book. In fact, I generally like novels that get down and dirty right off the bat, so I was a pretty happy camper.

And so I'm really really sorry that I couldn't get through this book, especially since it's a giveaway. But I just couldn't stand it anymore and had to put it down.
