Three men changed Battle's world in a matter of minutes.

"Revenge is a dish best served cold." And, Marcus aims to serve it all three times.

The Dwellers came into power after the Cartel was defeated. Their reign did not last long and the former state of Texas is once again a lawless territory with competing gangs plaguing the innocent. Battle's moral compass, or what is left of it, will not let him pass up a chance to set things right for those he stumbles upon.

His search for revenge meets him up with the most unlikely companions. One tries to kill him and then becomes his constant sidekick. Another is on a similar quest as Marcus and joins them to exact his own retribution. The trio, while somewhat comical, are a deadly combination.

Abrahams' fourth novel in The Traveler series, Rising, is fast-paced and gritty. True to the series' name, Marcus is always traveling. He cannot stay put no matter much he would like. You are more than likely to die from infection or bleed out from your wounds.
