These books are like candy. Once again, Pendleton's writing was completely engaging and the flow moved like warm butter over toast. As far as the writing of this story goes, it is 5-star caliber. I'm giving it 3-stars in comparison to the total series.

After the craziness that was #31 Arizona Ambush, Mack is asked by the Department of Justice bigwig, Hal Brognola, to help set up a heroin distributor for his federal task force to take down. Soon after we find out that Tommy Anders and Toby Ranger are leading the federal side of the operation. This is the face-palm side of the story; once again, Smiley Dublin and Carl Lyons have been captured by the mob. *Oh no!!*

It is still an interesting story-line (overused, but enjoyable.) It just surprises me how the Fed's SOG (Special Operations Group) can't complete a mission without one of their members (Smiley Dublin) always getting captured. Another member of their team once got captured, but she was turned into a turkey (tortured and left barely alive) in book #19. Toby Ranger, like always, is super annoying. Carl Lyons should have stuck with LAPD where he could beat the crap out of people, but now he's always getting the crap beat out of him by Mafia thugs.

However, despite its overuse, this story-line is a fun follow, but the action is pretty soft in this chapter of the bigger story. There are only six books left in Don Pendleton's portion of this character's story, and in the end, Hal makes Bolan a very tempting offer. I look forward to reading the final six.

This is the first Don Pendleton EXECUTIONER that I've read and I have to admit I wasn't blown away. The writing is cold, the dialogue tough to follow, and the attempts at humor leaden. While the DESTROYER series feels like you can pick up a book from anywhere in the run and get up to speed, this seems weighted down by its relation to the larger series arc. Frankly, I liked the ghost written ICE COLD KILL (EXECUTIONER #70) much more. The first two-thirds of TENNESSEE SMASH was slow going, but at least Pendleton picks up the pace a bit for the anti-climactic finale. I have four more Pendleton books in the 30s to read (only because #38 was mentioned in a recent DEAD MAN book) and I can't say I'm really itching to get to them. Maybe I'll chill out with a SHARPSHOOTER and another DESTROYER before I move on to MONDAY'S MOB (#33).
