Mending the Line begins nine months before the real story starts. Tyler is in Lower Fork working and doing what he does best – fishing. The whole summer he's had his eye on Jill Jennings but his girlfriend back home means he can't do anything about his feelings for her. Near the end of the summer, Jill breaks her leg running and Tyler is the one there to take her to the hospital. What he doesn't know is that Jill thinks he's amazingly hot. Nine months later after a summer back home, Tyler is back for one last summer before he and his dad go into business together. His one aim, now a single guy, is to get the girl he can't stop thinking about.

I really enjoyed getting a small backstory before the book really got going. It was nice to know that Tyler was really interested in Jill before anything happened and that he was good enough to think about his girlfriend back home. So many books I have read before have had characters that don't care about stuff like that and would have cheated but it was so good to see that Tyler had morals and stuck to them. Tyler was also a driven character who knows what he wants and will work hard to achieve his goals.

Jill was not quite as open a character as Tyler was, especially in regards to her feelings. I liked that there was a contrast between the two and that there was something to work at for them both. Jill has always been a runner and it is her dream to run in the Olympics. Breaking her leg messes everything up though and it also makes her question what she wants in life. Just as she's getting back on her feet, Tyler turns back up in town and Jill is secretly super happy about that. The previous summer, she liked him but knew he had a girlfriend and now, there isn't that problem anymore. Just like Tyler, I really liked Jill. She's a pretty grounded girl who also works extremely hard. Her training shows her dedication but she also has a wonderful personality. Due to her being so focused, Jill has kind of forgotten to have a social life but her broken leg makes her rethink everything.

The romance between Tyler and Jill was super sweet and great to discover. Tyler never rushes Jill which was another aspect of this book that I loved. He knows she hasn't had that much experience with guys and relationships and he is very patient with her while still managing to let his feelings be known. There are some pretty steamy scenes between Jill and Tyler but they weren't over the top nor was too much detail given. There was just enough to know what was going on which added a lot more passion between the characters. However, although Tyler doesn't rush Jill, their relationship appeared to go far too quickly. Some things that happened seemed to quite quickly and therefore, came across as a bit unrealistic.

The plot is pretty romance based so there isn't too much else going on. However, both Tyler and Jill have their families around them at different times. Along with the opening of the book, having families added into the story really helped to add depth to both main characters. Due to certain events and interactions, I was able to really get to know both Tyler and Jill as well as learning why they are the ways they are and why they act in certain ways.

Overall, Mending the Line was a pretty good book but it wasn't amazing.

This is a title that I particularly enjoyed. I found that the characters were all likable and relatively realistic; moreover, I found myself wanting to escape to the river-rafting, fly-fishing, outdoorsy lifestyle of what's clearly the setting for the Golden Rule Outfitters series.

So to Jill and Tyler - This novel's opening is amazing. I just...it's been so long since I've read a story wherein the romantic leads already know each other at the time of their novel that I found it incredibly refreshing. These are the kinds of stories that *I* write and partly due to the fact that I can't stand the love-at-first-sight nonsense that is packed into NA and YA romances. Happy day for me when I read "Mending the Line." Very soon into the novel, Hayes creates a real solid foundation for Tyler - from his family to his ambitions to his character and personality and, quickly thereafter, is able to contrast Tyler's homelife with Jill's for some added insight into what might end up being their ultimate compatibility. I liked Jill quite a bit as well. I like that she was a long distance runner and that she's had setbacks. Unlike so many of these books, our lead is not the winner. She's not some extraordinary human being with which no one can realistically relate. Instead, Jill is a hardworking athlete who struggles with her ambition vs. her ability. After painful surgeries and rehabilitation, her passion for the sport has waned. Making a drastic change in her life is what she needs. Although met with resistance from her family and coach (aka Dad), she gets a job and starts running only for the love of it. Another change she's trying to make is having a little fun and possibly indulging in her crush for the summer fishing guide, Ty.

Tyler Bloodworth is back in Colorado for another summer...ready to make Jill Jennings his. Last summer they shared lingering glances before her accident happened and he returned home to North Carolina. Now he's back, ready to pursue Jill, which is good because she might be hard to catch.

Ty supports Jill as she learns to love her job, falls in love with running again and starts to consider if she's up for competing. They both know that Ty has to leave at the end of the summer and they both put off talking about it out of fear. Is Jill willing to move away from her friends and family to be with him? Is he willing to leave his new teaching job to be with her? Everything is uncertain.

This sweetly conceived romance, with characters that are easy to relate to and appreciate, the author has managed to create a believable romance that is solidly grounded in emotions and situations that every reader can relate to.

Told from the point of view of the characters, this inclusion of their inner dialogue helps to define their personalities and provide a sense of people as well as the growth of their relationship. Dimension in the story is also increased with the inclusion of family members and their interactions and viewpoints: we are all aware that no relationship exists in a bubble of just two people and this is a welcome inclusion to both deepen and enhance the story.

This is a romance, and there is a personal choice for an author: making the romance completely sweet, or enhancing and utilizing the more erotic elements of a relationship to further detail the story. I loved this 38 chapter book. I'm all about romance, and there was plenty of it. I enjoyed being in on the secret when Jill and Ty started developing feelings for one another. My favorite stories are the ones that share both point-of-views. Other characters had their share of point-of-view, so it was fun hearing their opinions of the relationship. Some approved; some didn't.

My favorite lines: 1) Friend didn't mean boyfriend, but that didn't help Ty's mood. Of course, he wasn't exactly one to cast stones considering he'd yet to cut ties with Dana. 2) He knew he gambled quite a bit on instinct and an undeniable attraction. 3) "He only had eyes for you. Strange how he never made a move." 4) "You had to do what was best for you. Sometimes we hurt the ones who love us the most by spreading our wings."

If I could describe Ty and Jill in one word, it would be patient. All summer they had a crush on each other without letting the other one know. Jill broke her leg; thankfully he was there to help her. Once he returns home to the east coast, he dumps Dana (I admire this about Ty—he never cheated) and decides he'll want to return back to Colorado for next summer to pursue a relationship with Jill. I also respected her because she wasn't a homewrecker.

Mending the Line was such a cute love story. Anyone can relate who's ever experienced a crush. Or whoever has been in the beginning of a healthy relationship, experiencing the honeymoon phase.

The guys at the bar considered Jill an ice queen, so they bet that Ty couldn't win her heart. She finds out and gives him a hard time about it. I liked the sexual tension in those scenes. When they finally got together, there's more tension with her friend Lyle. Plus, her best friend Olivia is jealous; she's single and lonely. I loved that Ty was a nice guy, a listener, a gentleman, caring about Jill's feelings. He never pressured her; he moved at her pace, so he wouldn't scare her off. When they take it to the next level, those scenes were hot and steamy as well as sensual and intimate.
