But things go incredibly wrong when her home gets caught in fire a month before Christmas. With all her hard work disappearing before her eyes, she does the only think that she could think of at the time and that is to go to her friend Ethan (aka long-time crush) for help. But soon things start to change when Ethan insists on them to stay in his house until things got better. It is then that between the holidays and everything that was happening to them, that Allie starts to feel the chemistry between them grow, and she wonders if they could be something more just in time for Christmas.

Ethan Dane has always had a thing for Allie every since they met at a friend's wedding. But at the time she had actually turned him down, but he always hoped for a chance to be with her. Now that she is staying at his house everything that he had hidden from her could no longer be a secret and that could risk their friendship. The Billionaire's Christmas Proposal is a book I've been eager to get my hands on as its predecessor, *The Billionaire's Christmas Baby* is a festive read I could read over and over again. And whilst it does bring all I expect to find in a book from Victoria, and I did fall in love with Ethan and Allie and their story, I have to be honest and say it's not my favourite from her. There were parts to the story that I don't feel were necessarily

needed; in comparison to her previous books it was heavier on tropes and there were elements that wouldn't have been missed if you'd taken them away, giving an opportunity to give the reader a little more on those that mattered. And if this had been the case, you would still be presented with a lovely romance with an equally lovely couple who have secrets and uneasy pasts.

While his family had money, Ethan wasn't particularly close to them. Where once his father doted on him, after Ethan was diagnosed with leukemia everything changed. His father, figuring Ethan wouldn't be around much longer, gave all his time and attention to Ethan's brother. Ever since then Ethan has been in constant competition with the man. At the moment it's over a valuable piece of property in the heart of the city that has come up for sale. The plan is to purchase it, put up condos, and make a huge profit from it. There's just one problem. That particular corner is where Allie works, the woman Ethan has been trying to convince to go out with him ever since they met at the wedding of their two best friends.

When Allie's apartment catches fire and she and her younger sister are left homeless, she goes to the only person she knows for a fact will help her. Ethan. While she's refused all his invitations until now it doesn't mean she isn't attracted to him. She is. Big time. However, at the moment she has too much on her plate to concern herself with dating. She's taken responsibility for her sister because of their mother's drinking problem, the shelter where she works is about to be sold, leaving most of the kids with nowhere to go, and then there's the secret from her past she doesn't want anyone to know about.

When Allie shows up at Ethan's work place looking traumatized, Ethan most assuredly comes to her aid. He moves her, her sister and their dog in with him. It's no hardship having Allie living under the same roof with him and maybe, now, since he's in such close proximity to her, it will be easier to convince her they should be together. If only he could figure out a way to save the shelter without losing out to his brother. If he doesn't come up with a solution and soon, any hope he has of making her his might be lost forever.

I really liked the plot. It was somewhat unique to me in the fact that Ethan has never shared the fact he once had cancer with anybody. Outside of his family, the only people aware of what he'd been through are his doctor and the nurse who once cared for him. Every year, however, on the same date, he gets a physical to make sure everything is all right, and every year he works himself into a tizzy waiting for the results. Allie learns his secret one day and the entire story comes pouring out. His loneliness, his fear, how his father rejected him in favor of his brother. It's shaped the man he is today and ends up having an enormous effect on his relationship with Allie. I found myself rooting for him yet, at the same time, wanting to slap him especially when his attitude threatens to destroy all that is good in his life: his relationship with Allie.

Allie was one of those people everyone likes as soon as they meet her. She has a warm, bubbly personality, which makes her ideal to direct the shelter. She easily relates to the kids and they adore her. She can't bear the idea of them being displaced when the shelter is sold. Allie always puts others before herself, including her mother who is undeserving of it, although she did come through for Allie once when she really needed it. Still, it's difficult for Allie to see that her generous nature sometimes leaves little room for her to think about her own wants and needs. This is why Ethan goes out of his way to do nice things for her.

I would definitely recommend this story. It was a very pleasant way to pass the time. I look forward to more from this author.

technically a series you do get a little background info from this book.

Victoria James is a relatively new author to me, although it hasn't stopped me devouring and loving every one of her new releases over the last couple of months. I will be honest and say that *The Billionaires Christmas Proposal* didn't really live up to the high standards that I have attributed to this author now.

"I've wanted you, and I was too afraid to ever take a chance with someone like you."

I think the main talent and skill of Victoria's writing is that she takes simple themes and turns them into beautiful stories. Nothing is rushed everything is built solidly and the story as well as the characters are given a chance to develop at an organic and steady pace. And for me that is where this book struggled, to my count there are 4 tropes at play, and if I wanted to be completely pedantic you could actually split two of them and go as far to say 6, and that is where the problems start for me, half of them were really not needed.

In the previous books I have read by the author, there have only really ever been two or three at most in play. The story between Allie and Ethan was crowded up with a bunch of secondary characters and plot-lines that detracted from the focus of the relationship that was three years in the making between them, not to mention the loss of the shelter that Allie worked at and the secret's that Ethan was holding close to his heart about his childhood. These were the three parts of the story I wanted to get involved in and fall in love with, the whole host of familial BS that was added in was really not needed.

Oddly this has been a big bug-bear for me with a huge number of Entangled titles lately, and not just this author, for some reason it seems that the general belief at the moment is to throw the *kitchen sink* of familial drama at things, and a lot of the time, and particularly with an author like Victoria who has proven to not need all the additional drama, the '*less is more*' ethos works perfectly.

This is still a pretty good read, the second half by far supersedes the first for me. I just really hope that the author goes back to her previous writing methodology, because she really has the talent and skill, to keep it simple and deliver it perfectly.
