It was dark. It was cold. It was starting to snow and Nate Horne needs to get home before the full force of the approaching Colorado snow storm prevents his return. Imagine his surprise when a dainty sneeze escapes from the tarp behind him; and his even bigger surprise when enormous dark eyes peer at him from the end of his pointed gun. Frightened, half-frozen and at the point of tears, Ararbella Taube blows into Nate Horne's life like a blizzard. Just what is he going to do with this lovely creature?
